1. COUNTRY HIGHLIGHTS

Finland is one of the three Member States (along with Denmark and Sweden) where respondents say that climate change is the most serious problem facing the world (26%, EU average: 15%).

Close to two-thirds say that it is a “very serious” problem (65%), a nine percentage point rise since 2013. More than half believe that business (53%) and the government (51%) are responsible for tackling climate change. A high proportion also thinks that the European Union and citizens themselves are responsible (both 38%).

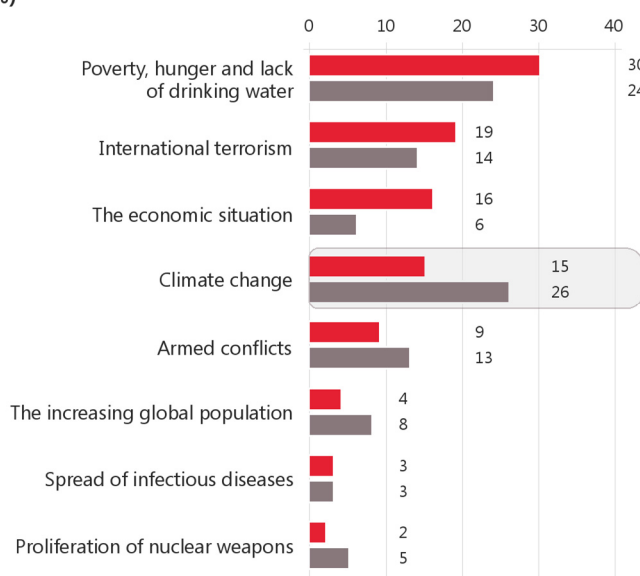
Two-thirds of respondents say they have taken some action to fight climate change in the past six months (66%, EU average: 49%). When specific measures are mentioned, however, this figure rises to 96%. Actions include:

- 80% (+7 percentage points since 2013) try to reduce waste and regularly separate it for recycling
- 67% try to cut down consumption of disposable items whenever possible (+12 percentage points since 2013)
- 53% buy locally produced food whenever possible (+15 percentage points since 2013)

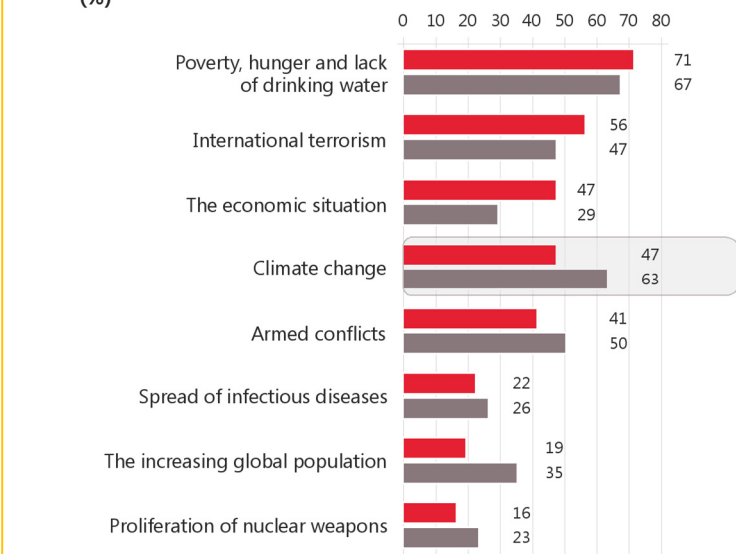
There is a clear consensus (91%) that fighting climate change will only be effective if all countries of the world act together. There is also strong support for national action to increase the use of renewable energy (95%) and improve energy efficiency (91%) by 2030.

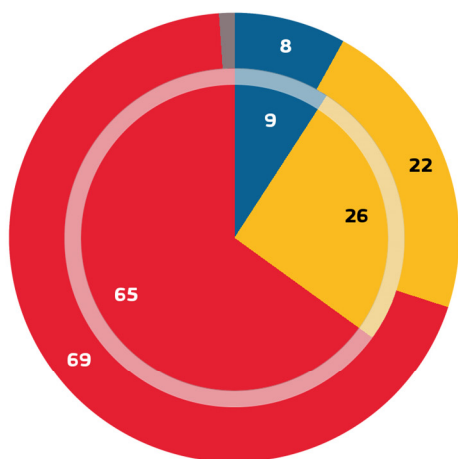

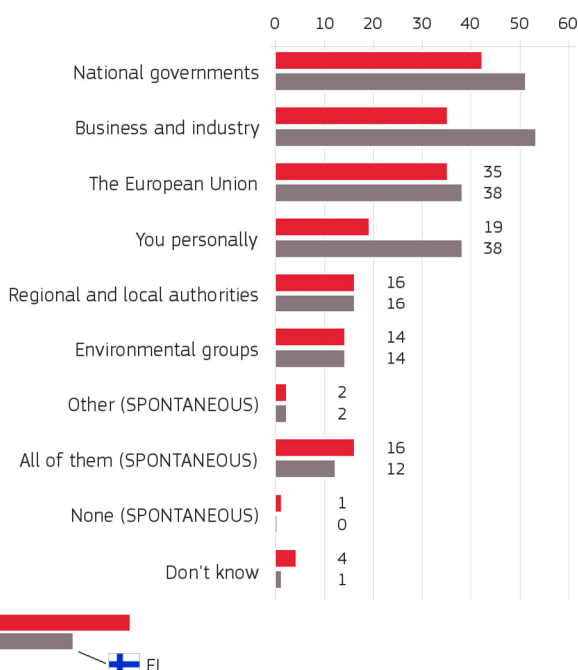

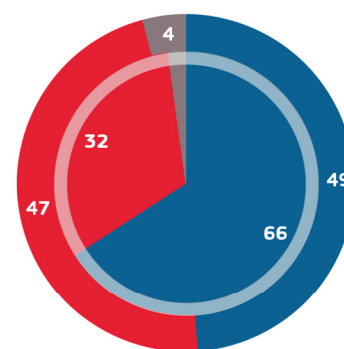
QA3 In your opinion, who within the EU is responsible for tackling climate change? (MULTIPLE ANSWERS POSSIBLE)

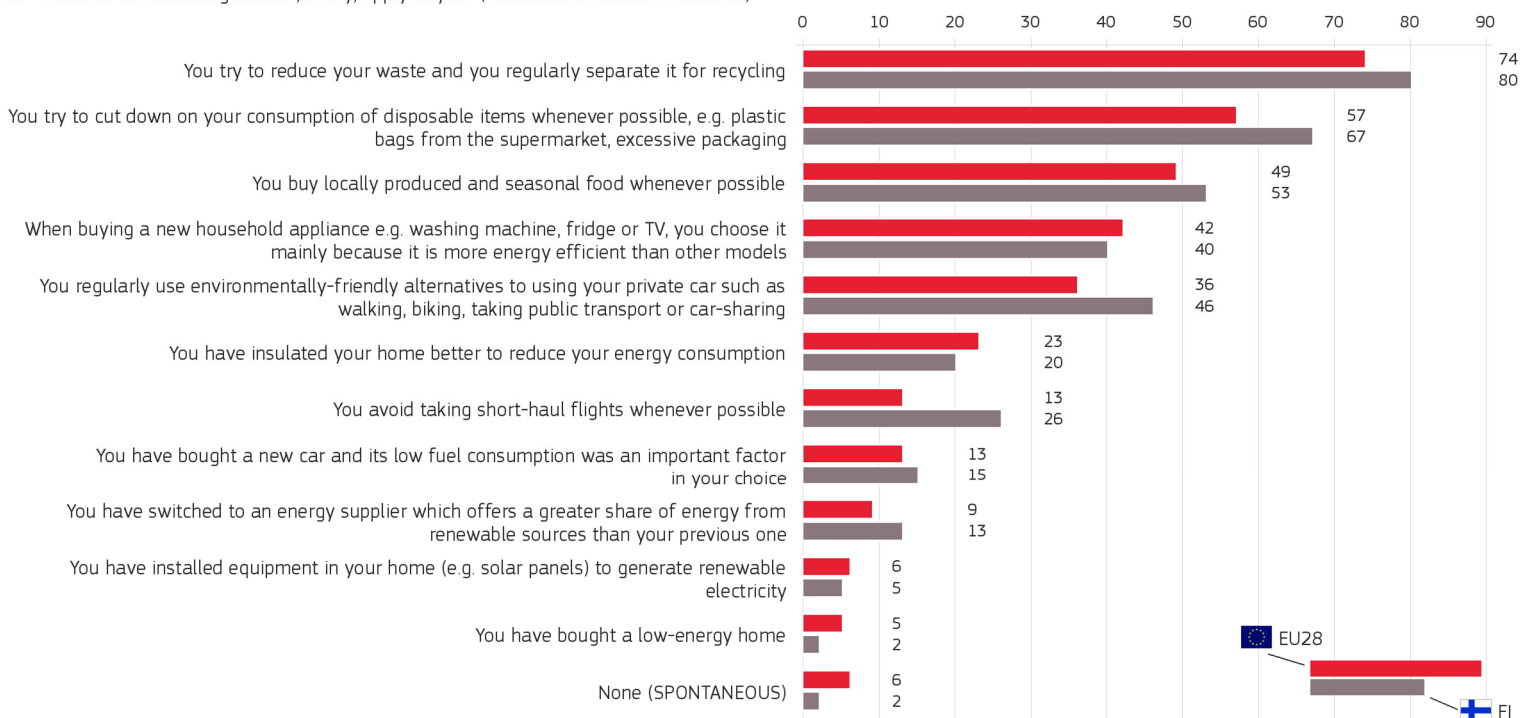

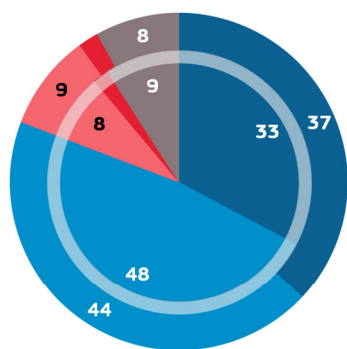
QA6 Which of the following actions, if any, apply to you? (MULTIPLE ANSWERS POSSIBLE)

Fighting climate change and using energy more efficiently can boost the economy and jobs in the EU (%)

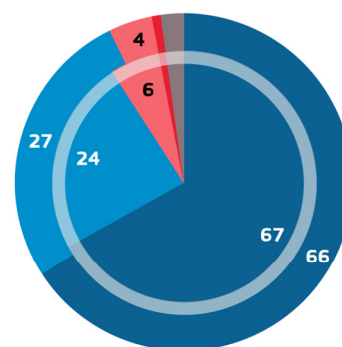

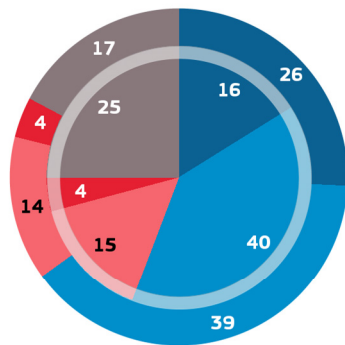

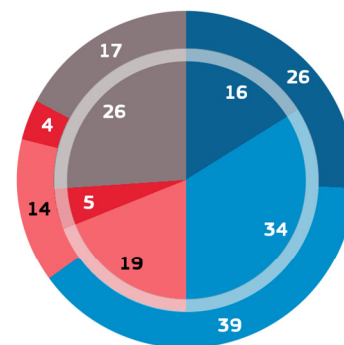
QA4.3 To what extent do you agree or disagree with each of the following statements?

Reducing fossil fuel imports from outside the EU can increase the security of EU energy supplies (%)

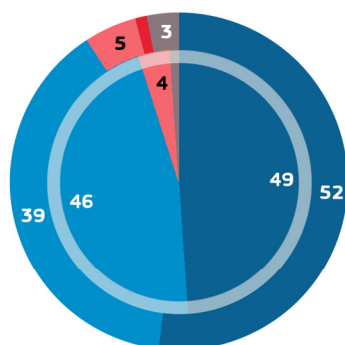

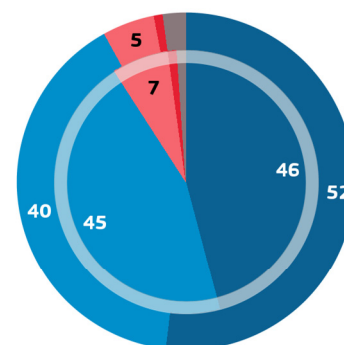
QA7 How important do you think it is that the (NATIONALITY) government sets targets to increase the amount of renewable energy used, such as wind or solar power, by 2030? (%)
