Methodology: face-to-face

1. COUNTRY HIGHLIGHTS

There is widespread concern about climate change in Luxembourg and most respondents seem to act accordingly. Nearly seven in ten believe that it is a “very serious” problem (69%, +3 points since 2013).

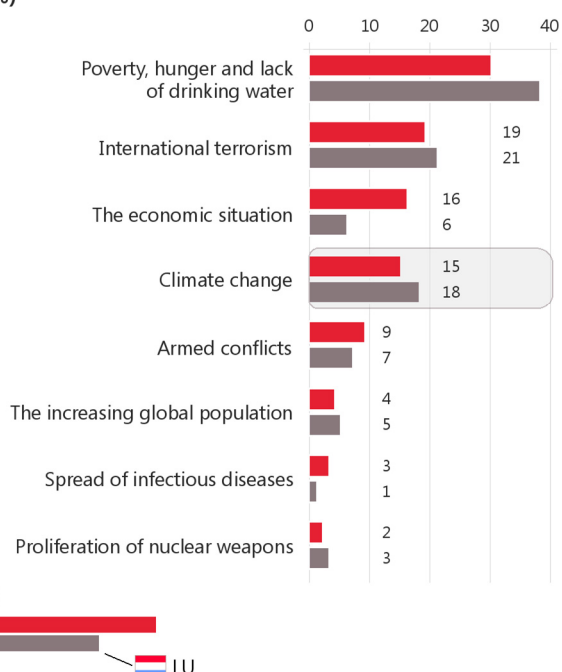
Nearly one-third of respondents believe they themselves are responsible for tackling climate change (32%, compared with the EU average of 19%). This is not surprising, since Luxembourg is among the countries where respondents are most likely to say they have taken personal action to fight climate change in the past six months (71%, compared with the EU average of 49%). In fact, when presented with a list of specific measures, this rises to 99%. The survey shows:

- Almost nine in ten (87%, compared with 74% across the EU) try to reduce waste and regularly separate it for recycling
- 70% try to cut down consumption of disposable items whenever possible (EU average: 57%)
- More than six in ten respondents buy locally produced and seasonal food whenever possible (62%, EU average: 49%). This is the measure recording the highest increase since 2013 in Luxembourg (+14 percentage points).

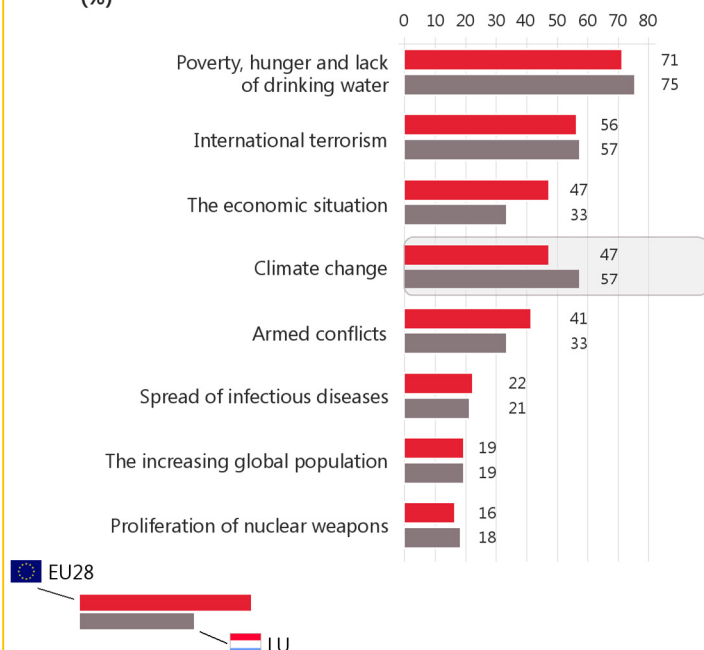
More than nine in ten respondents (95%) agree that fighting climate change will only be effective if all countries of the world act together.

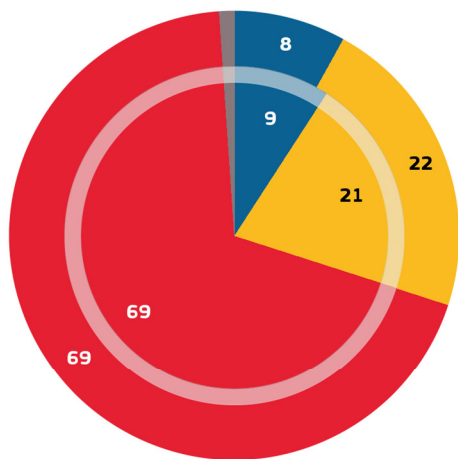

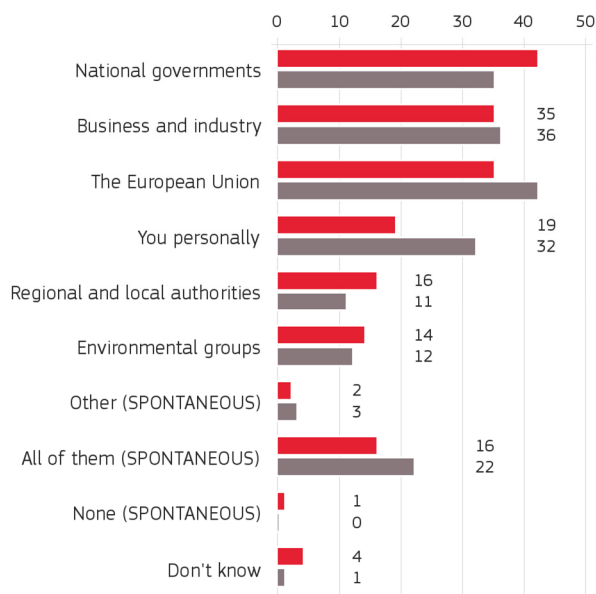

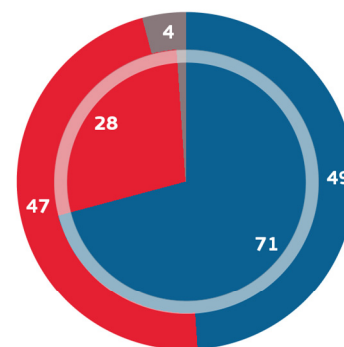
QA3 In your opinion, who within the EU is responsible for tackling climate change? (MULTIPLE ANSWERS POSSIBLE)

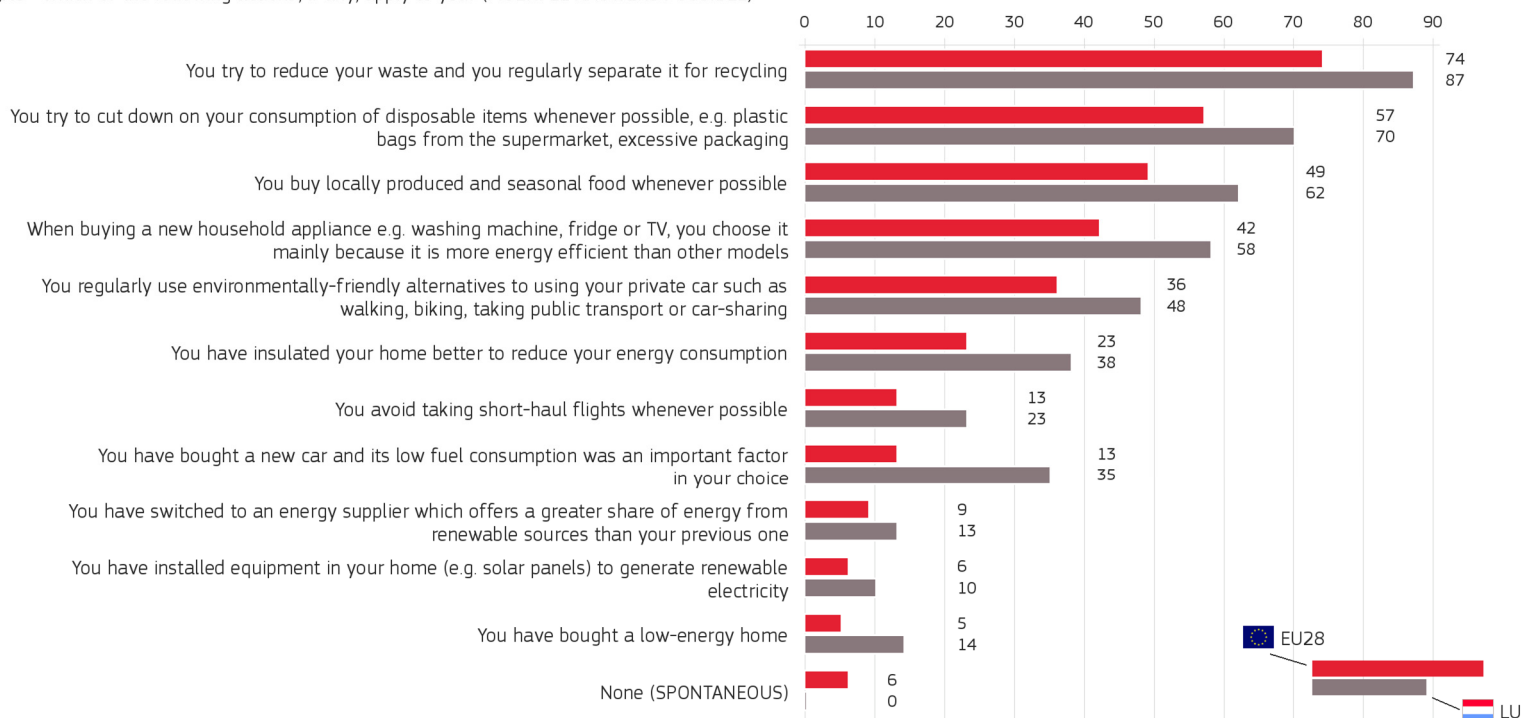

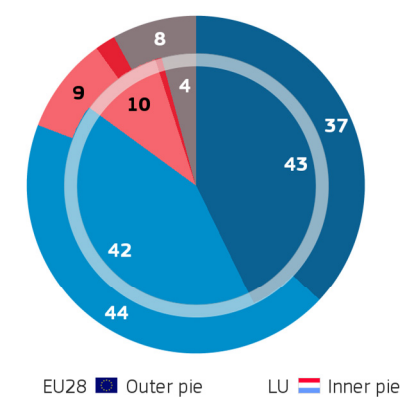
QA6 Which of the following actions, if any, apply to you? (MULTIPLE ANSWERS POSSIBLE)

QA4.1 To what extent do you agree or disagree with each of the following statements?

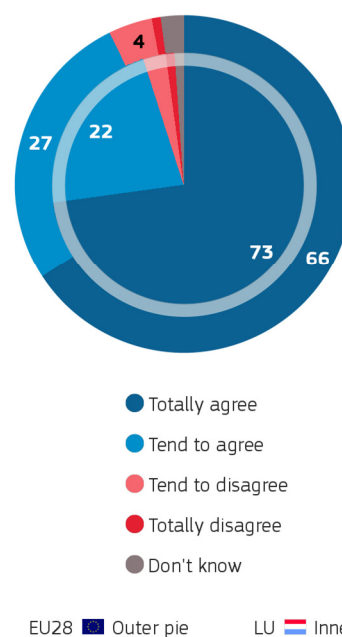
Fighting climate change and using energy more efficiently can boost the economy and jobs in the EU (%)

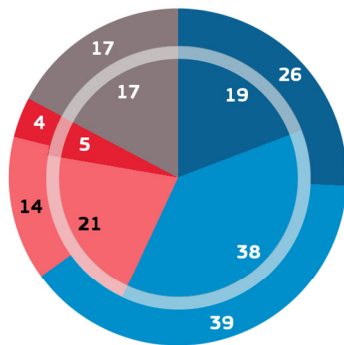

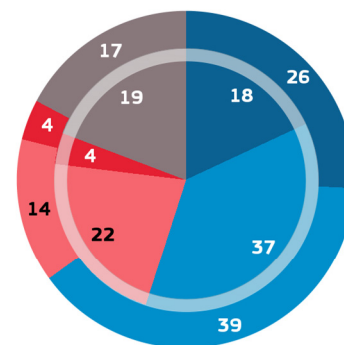
QA4.3 To what extent do you agree or disagree with each of the following statements?

Reducing fossil fuel imports from outside the EU can increase the security of EU energy supplies (%)

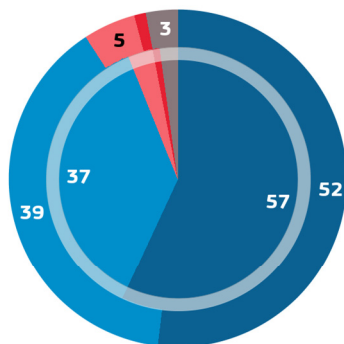

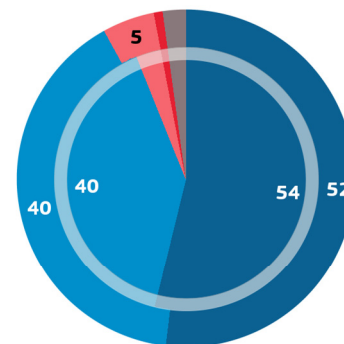
QA7 How important do you think it is that the (NATIONALITY) government sets targets to increase the amount of renewable energy used, such as wind or solar power, by 2030? (%)
