General Conclusions

- Harmonisation of implementation is continuously improving across MS – crucial in ensuring proper implementation of EU ETS
- Information exchange between all actors is central (CAs, NABs, verifiers, EA). Has improved in Phase III, but further improvements can be made
- Key challenges remain as described in the breakout sessions





Conclusions – task forces

- Task force members appear more willing to be open, share issues and exchange best practice
 - However, work of task forces can often fall to a limited number of key individuals
- Each task force has identified key challenges going forward
 - E.g. improving accessibility and use of guidance, harmonising and improving information exchange, quality of verification reports, IT awareness and needs, effective enforcement in aviation





Recommendations

- MS to step up active participation in task forces and stimulate use of outputs by CAs
- MS/TFs to continue to improve information exchange between all actors involved
- Conference outputs to be incorporated into task force work programmes
- Commission to continue work supporting implementation (e.g. update guidance / indexing / Declare / Article 21 e-tool)
