- 1. Prolongation of existing contract with Ecofys/Fraunhofer/Ökoinstitute, in the form of technical support for finalisation of the benchmarks and other allocation rules for the ETS
 - Priority: Development of detailed rules sector by sector and support in filling data gaps, as identified in the report



- 2. Technical support for finalisation of the benchmarks and other allocation rules for the ETS <u>Umweltbundesamt Austria</u> (in capacity as independent consultant)
 - Priorities: Quality criteria for verification of benchmark curves, Draft rules for activity data collection (production, heat production)
 - Guidance for setting installations boundaries, MRV rules, rules for allocation to waste gases, non-traded products etc.
- 3. Support to the Member States and the Commission in applying the benchmarks and other allocation rules (to start by mid 2010)
 - Support in developing detailed guidance documents on application of the allocation rules
 - > Helpdesk (email and phone) and workshops in a number of MS



Limited data collection for validation of the benchmarks 4. (TBD)

- Through a standardised data collection survey
- Engagement with MS experts (through the task force)

Support for the proportionate Impact Assessment (TBD) **5.**

- Support on the assessment of methodological choices
- Information allowing consideration of the most efficient techniques, substitutes, alternative production processes, high efficiency cogeneration, efficient energy recovery of waste gases, use of biomass and capture and storage of CO2



6. Assessment of international negotiations

Study contract to support the Commission in preparing an analytical report assessing the situation with regard to energy-intensive sectors or sub-sectors that have been determined to be exposed to significant risks of carbon leakage in view of revising allocations/benchmark rules.

Task force with Member States

Aims:

- Development of detailed administrative rules and guidance for allocation. E.g.
 - Input on guidance for the verification of historic activity data; New entrants and closure rules
- Testing of the draft technical allocation rules on installation basis and on aggregated basis



Task force with Member States

Further aims:

- Revising the draft technical and administrative allocation rules based on the feedback
- Verification of benchmark figures
- Assess impact of proposed allocation rules



Technical working group with Member States

Aims:

To discuss and to seek consensus on allocation issues
