1. COUNTRY HIGHLIGHTS

Nearly one in five respondents in France identify climate change as the most serious problem facing the world (18%, above the EU average of 15%). However, close to seven in ten say it is a “very serious” problem (69%, +5 percentage points since 2013).

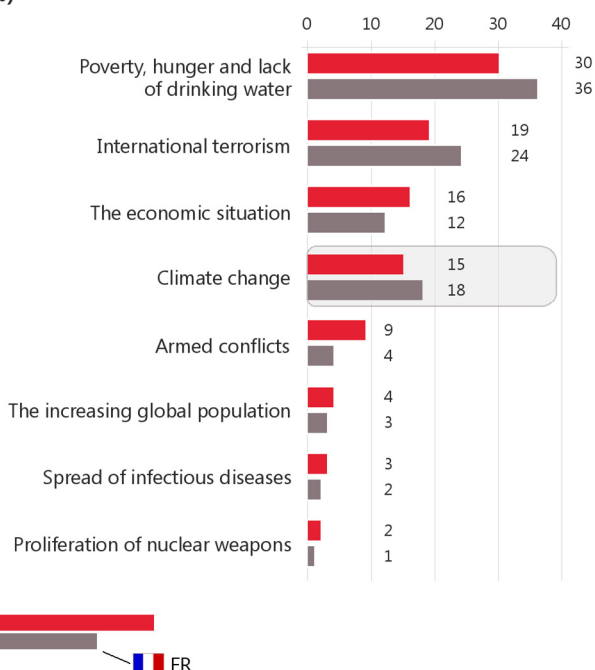
More than half say they have personally taken some action to fight climate change in the past six months (57%, above the EU average of 49%, and a seven point rise since 2013). When presented with a list of specific actions, this figure rises to 96%. In terms of practical measures:

- Almost nine in ten (87%, +7 percentage points since 2013) try to reduce their waste and regularly separate it for recycling, sharing first place with Sweden and Luxembourg for this activity
- Almost two-thirds try to cut their consumption of disposable items whenever possible (65%, +10 percentage points)
- More than six in ten buy locally produced food whenever possible (61%, +12 percentage points)

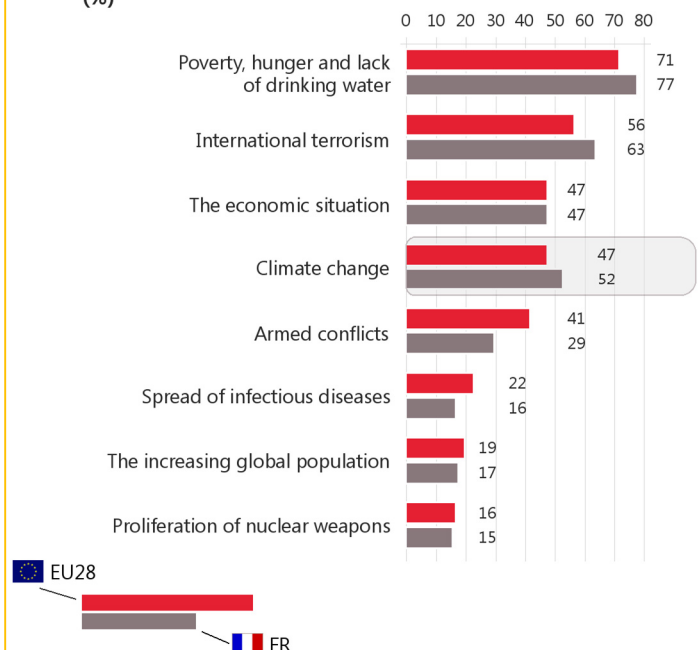
A large majority support national action to improve energy efficiency (92%) and increase the use of renewable energy (90%) by 2030. The vast majority of respondents (94%) believe that fighting climate change will only be effective if all countries of the world act together.

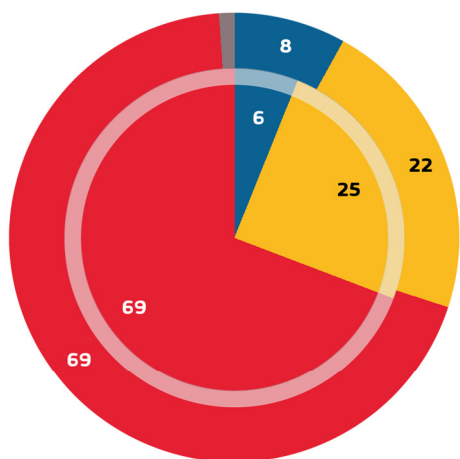

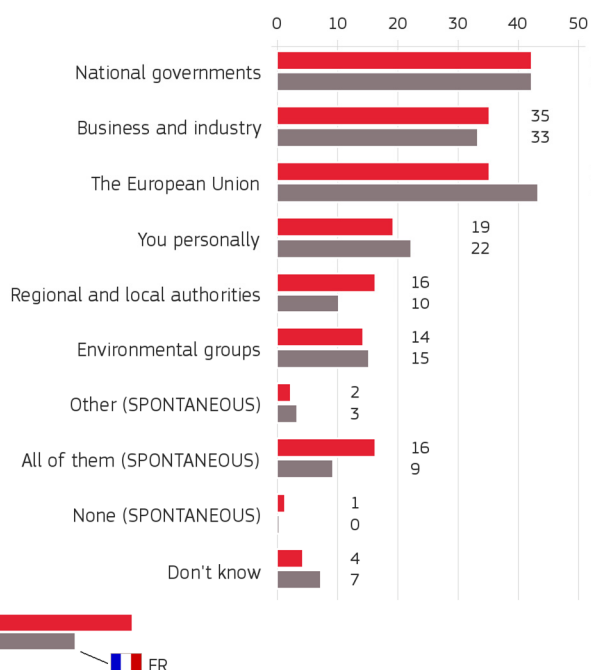

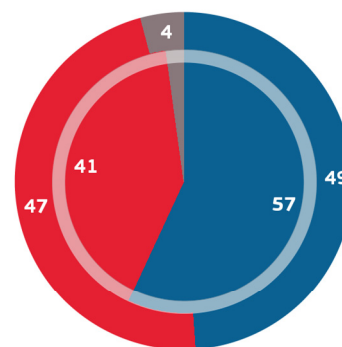
QA3 In your opinion, who within the EU is responsible for tackling climate change? (MULTIPLE ANSWERS POSSIBLE)

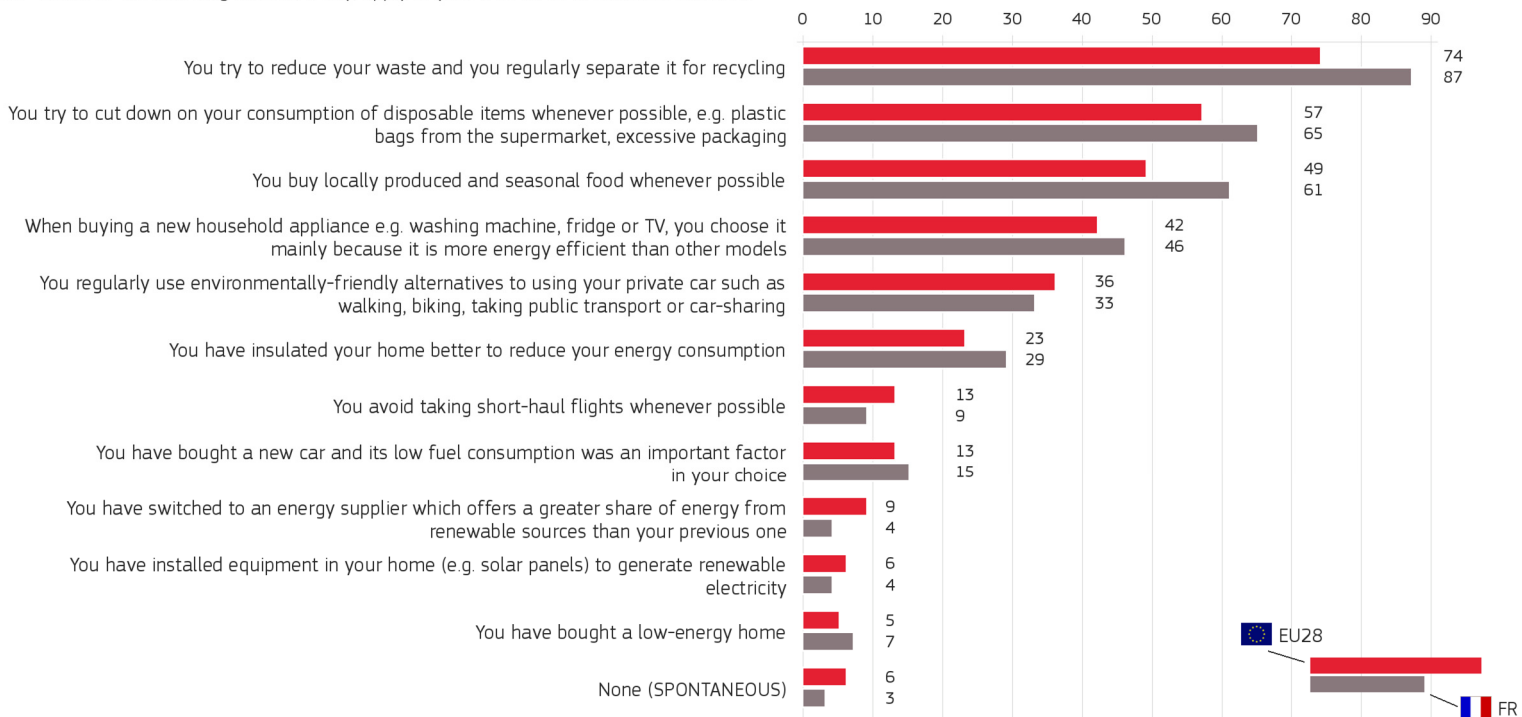

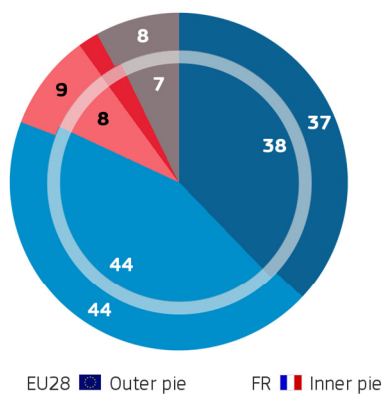
QA6 Which of the following actions, if any, apply to you? (MULTIPLE ANSWERS POSSIBLE)

QA4.1 To what extent do you agree or disagree with each of the following statements?

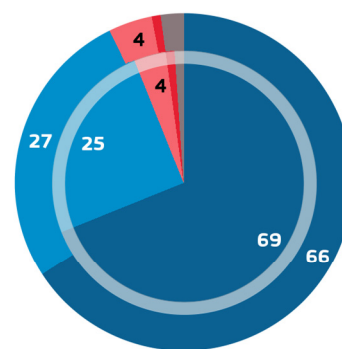
Fighting climate change and using energy more efficiently can boost the economy and jobs in the EU (%)

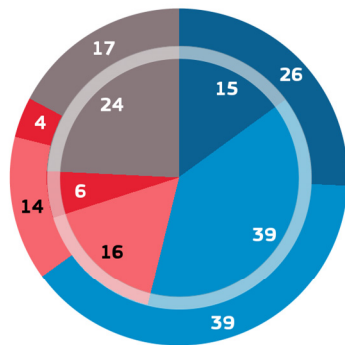

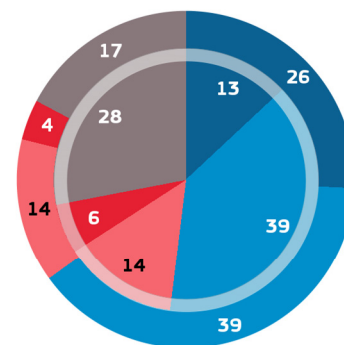
QA4.3 To what extent do you agree or disagree with each of the following statements?

Reducing fossil fuel imports from outside the EU can increase the security of EU energy supplies (%)

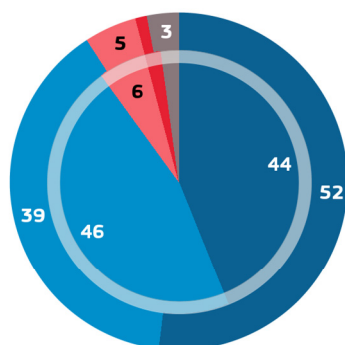

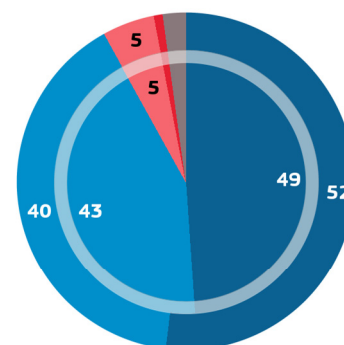
QA7 How important do you think it is that the (NATIONALITY) government sets targets to increase the amount of renewable energy used, such as wind or solar power, by 2030? (%)
