1. COUNTRY HIGHLIGHTS


Nearly eight in ten respondents in France believe climate change is a 'very serious' problem (79%, EU average 74%). Nearly one in seven (14%) see it as the single most serious problem facing the world, above the EU average (12%).


Nearly six in ten say they have taken personal action to fight climate change in the past six months (58%, EU average 49%). However, when given specific examples this rises to 96% (EU average 90%), suggesting that many do not associate certain actions with tackling climate change.

- The proportion of respondents who try to reduce waste and regularly separate it for recycling (83%) is significantly above the EU average (71%).
- Those surveyed in France are also more likely than the EU average to better insulate their home in order to reduce energy consumption (24%, EU average 18%) and to take lower energy consumption into account when buying a new household appliance (43%, EU average 37%).

Over eight in ten respondents agree that fighting climate change and using energy more efficiently can boost the economy and jobs in the EU (82%, EU average 79%), while more than nine in ten believe it is important that their government sets targets to increase the amount of renewable energy used by 2030 (94%, EU average 89%) and provides support for improving energy efficiency by 2030 (93%, EU average 88%).















7. ATTITUDES TOWARDS REDUCING FOSSIL FUEL IMPORTS AND TRANSITION TO CLEAN ENERGIES


QC4.3 To what extent do you agree or disagree with each of the following statements?

QC7 How important do you think it is that the (NATIONALITY) government sets targets to increase the amount of renewable energy used, such as wind or solar power, by 2030?


