Editing board - objectives

- Analysis of the technical and administrative aspects regarding the legal implementation of a type-approval procedure for heavy-duty vehicles with respect to CO2 emissions
- Development of a complete procedure for the measurement and certification of the CO2 emissions of the heavy-duty vehicles
- Preparation of a legal text of the procedure to be introduced into the European legislation



Editing board – objectives (2)

- Timeline:
 - Trucks legislative proposal to be ready by the mid of 2016
 - Busses (around one year delay)
 - M2/N2/N1 vehicles still to be decided



Editing board - objectives (3)

- The procedure will serve different purposes:
 - For OEMs to have a robust and objective tool which will allow a fair assessment of the performance of the vehicles
 - For the legislator, to be able to correctly assess the emissions from heavy-duty vehicles, to be able to develop measures which will incentivise further improvements in the CO2 emissions
 - For the Member States in order to implement additional measures aiming at promoting more energy efficient vehicles



Editing board - objectives (4)

- The process which will be developed has to be:
 - Robust
 - Repeatable / reproducible
 - Adaptable
- Example of aspects that need to be considered:
 - Legal framework
 - Testing procedure (components / vehicles)
 - Verification of the results
 - Role of the type-approval authorities
 - Conformity of production
 - Responsibilities of different parties



Legal framework

- European type-approval framework currently applied to the measurement and certification of the CO2 emission values of light-duty vehicles
- CO2 emission testing procedure for heavy-duty engines already existing in the Regulation 595/2009 (Euro VI)
- Introduction of the heavy-duty whole vehicle fuel consumption into the European type-approval the most natural approach




Modus operandi

- The process will be managed by DG GROW in cooperation with DG CLIMA and with a support of the consultant
- The Editing board should discuss possible options and take decisions about the strategic issues related to the development of the certification procedure
- Composition of the Group should enable collecting different views without negatively impacting the efficient decision-making process

- The Editing Board will meet on regular basis (every 4-6 weeks)
- Next meetings of the Editing board will take place on 2 March
- Following meeting are set tentatively to:
 - 9 April
 - 12 May
 - 18 June
 - 15 July
- Meetings of the dedicated sub-groups will be convened according to the needs

Objectives for the next meeting

- to discuss in detail identified certification options
- to analyse possible implementation of the testing procedure into the European legislative framework
- to analyse necessary building blocks for the certification process
- to take stock of and review the technical aspects including an analysis of necessary inputs from other projects (ex. Lot 4)
- to discuss the set-up and the operation of the Editing board and its sub-groups
