1. COUNTRY HIGHLIGHTS


More than eight in ten (86%) respondents in Poland say climate change is a serious problem, with 56% saying it is "very serious". Only 7% of those surveyed think they themselves are responsible for tackling climate change, one of the lowest scores in the EU, while a much larger proportion believe governments (40%) and the EU (35%) are responsible.


However, while less likely than respondents in other EU countries to say they have personally taken some action to fight climate change in the past six months (30%, EU average: 49%), when asked about specific practical measures, much greater involvement is revealed (85%). The survey shows that:

- Almost two-thirds (62%, +3 percentage points since 2013) try to reduce waste and regularly separate it for recycling
- 45% (+9 percentage points since 2013) try to cut down consumption of disposable items whenever possible
- 35% now buy local food products whenever possible, a 13 percentage point rise since 2013

There is considerable support for national action on improving energy efficiency (85%) and increasing the use of renewable energy by 2030 (83%). Close to nine in ten respondents (89%) agree that fighting climate change will only be effective if all countries of the world act together.



3. EUROPEAN PERCEPTIONS OF CLIMATE CHANGE 2/2






PL Inner pie

EU28 Outer pie















Reducing fossil fuel imports from outside the EU can benefit the EU economically (%)


