1. COUNTRY HIGHLIGHTS

The vast majority of respondents in Bulgaria (80%, well above the EU average of 69%) consider climate change to be a "very serious" problem. This is a substantial increase since 2013 (+13 percentage points). For 13%, this is the most serious problem facing the world (+4 percentage points since 2013).


Around one in five respondents say they have personally taken action to fight climate change in the past six months (19%), although when they are shown a list of practical measures, this figure rises to 87%, suggesting that many respondents do not necessarily connect some of these actions with tackling climate change. The measures they are most likely to have taken are:


- Trying to buy locally produced and seasonal food whenever possible (53%), a huge increase since 2013 (+27 percentage points)
- Trying to cut down their consumption of disposable items such as plastic bags (48%, +21 percentage points)

More than nine out of ten respondents (92%) agree that fighting climate change will only be effective if all countries of the world act together.

There is also widespread agreement that fighting climate change and using energy more efficiently could boost the European economy and jobs (78%, +3 percentage points since 2013).




















