Service contract to Support the Implementation of Article 6.2 of the Paris Agreement

TENDER SPECIFICATIONS

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1. Information on tendering

1.1. Participation

Participation in this tender procedure is restricted to the invited candidates only.

1.2. Contractual conditions

The tenderer should bear in mind the provisions of the draft contract which specifies the rights and obligations of the contractor, particularly those on payments, performance of the contract, confidentiality, and checks and audits.

1.3. Compliance with applicable law

The tender must comply with applicable environmental, social and labour law obligations established by Union law, national legislation, collective agreements or the international environmental, social and labour conventions listed in Annex X to Directive 2014/24/EU¹.

1.4. Joint tenders

A joint tender is a situation where a tender is submitted by a group of economic operators (natural or legal persons). Joint tenders may include subcontractors in addition to the members of the group.

In case of joint tender, all members of the group assume joint and several liability towards the Contracting Authority for the performance of the contract as a whole, i.e. both financial and operational liability. Nevertheless, tenderers must designate one of the economic operators as a single point of contact (the leader) for the Contracting Authority for administrative and financial aspects as well as operational management of the contract.

After the award, the Contracting Authority will sign the contract either with all members of the group, or with the leader on behalf of all members of the group, authorised by the other members via powers of attorney.

1.5. Subcontracting

Subcontracting is permitted but the contractor will retain full liability towards the Contracting Authority for performance of the contract as a whole.

Tenderers are required to identify all subcontractors and provide an indication of the proportion of subcontracting. See Annex 2, questionnaire for joint bids and subcontracting.

Directive 2014/24/EU of the European Parliament and of the Council of 26 February 2014 on public procurement and repealing Directive 2004/18/EC (OJ L 94, 28.3.2014, p. 65).

During contract performance, the change of any subcontractor identified in the tender or additional subcontracting will be subject to prior written approval of the Contracting Authority.

1.6. Structure and content of the tender

The tenders must be presented as follows:

Part A: Identification of the tenderer (see section 1.7)

Part B: Non-exclusion (see section 2.2)

Part C: Selection (see section 2.3)

Part D: Technical offer (see section 3)

Part E: Financial offer (see section 2.6)

1.7. Identification of the tenderer

The tender must include a cover letter signed by an authorised representative presenting the name of the tenderer (including all entities in case of joint tender) and identified subcontractors if applicable, and the name of the single contact point (leader) in relation to this procedure. Coherence must be ensured between the information in the cover letter and in Annex 1.

In case of joint tender, the cover letter must be signed either by an authorised representative for each member, or by the leader authorised by the other members with powers of attorney. The signed powers of attorney must be included in the tender as well. Subcontractors that are identified in the tender must provide a letter of intent signed by an authorised representative stating their willingness to provide the service presented in the tender and in line with the present tender specifications.

The tenderer (and each member of the group in case of joint tender) must declare whether it is a Small or Medium Sized Enterprise in accordance with <u>Commission Recommendation</u> 2003/361/EC. This information is used for statistical purposes only.

All tenderers (including all members of the group in case of joint tender) must provide a signed Legal Entity Form with its supporting evidence. The form is available on: http://ec.europa.eu/budget/contracts_grants/info_contracts/legal_entities_legal_entities_en.cf

Tenderers that are already registered in the Contracting Authority's accounting system (i.e. they have already been direct contractors) must provide the form but are not obliged to provide the supporting evidence.

The tenderer (or the leader in case of joint tender) must provide a Financial Identification Form with its supporting documents. Only one form per tender should be submitted. No form

is needed for subcontractors and other members of the group in case of joint tender. The form is available on: http://ec.europa.eu/budget/contracts grants/info_contracts/index_en.cfm

2. EVALUATION AND AWARD

2.1.Evaluation steps

The evaluation is based solely on the information provided in the submitted tender. It involves the following:

- Verification of non-exclusion of tenderers on the basis of the exclusion criteria
- Selection of tenderers on the basis of selection criteria
- Verification of compliance with the minimum requirements set out in these tender specifications
- Evaluation of tenders on the basis of the award criteria

The contracting authority may reject abnormally low tenders, in particular if it established that the tenderer or a subcontractor does not comply with applicable obligations in the fields of environmental, social and labour law.

The Contracting Authority will assess these criteria in no particular order. The successful tenderer must pass all criteria to be awarded the contract.

2.2. Verification of non-exclusion

All tenderers must provide a declaration on honour (see Annex 5), signed and dated by an authorised representative, stating that they are not in one of the situations of exclusion listed in that declaration on honour.

In case of joint tender, each member of the group must provide a declaration on honour signed by an authorised representative.

In case of subcontracting, subcontractors whose capacity is necessary to fulfil the selection criteria must provide a declaration on honour signed by an authorised representative.

The Contracting Authority reserves the right to verify whether the successful tenderer is in one of the situations of exclusion by requiring, at any point during the procedure, the supporting documents listed in the declaration on honour.

The obligation to submit supporting evidence does not apply to international organisations.

A tenderer (or a member of the group in case of joint tender, or a subcontractor) is not required to submit the documentary evidence if it has already been submitted for another procurement procedure and provided the documents were issued not more than one year before the date of their request by the contracting authority and are still valid at that date. In such cases, the tenderer must declare on its honour that the documentary evidence has already been provided in a previous procurement procedure, indicate the reference of the procedure and confirm that that there has been no change in its situation.

A tenderer (or a member of the group in case of joint tender, or a subcontractor) is not required to submit a specific document if the contracting authority can access the document in question on a national database free of charge.

2.3. Selection criteria

Tenderers must prove their legal, regulatory, economic, financial, technical and professional capacity to carry out the work subject to this call for tender.

The tenderer may rely on the capacities of other entities, regardless of the legal nature of the links which it has with them. It must in that case prove to the Contracting Authority that it will have at its disposal the resources necessary for performance of the contract, for example by producing an undertaking on the part of those entities to place those resources at its disposal.

2.3.1. Declaration and evidence

The tenderers (and each member of the group in case of joint tender) and subcontractors whose capacity is necessary to fulfil the selection criteria must provide the declaration on honour (see Annex 5), signed and dated by an authorised representative, stating that they fulfil the selection criteria applicable to them individually. In case of joint tender or subcontracting, the criteria applicable to the tenderer as a whole will be verified by combining the various declarations for a consolidated assessment.

This declaration is part of the declaration used for exclusion criteria (see section 2.2) so only one declaration covering both aspects should be provided by each concerned entity.

The Contracting Authority will evaluate selection criteria on the basis of the declaration on honour and evidence submitted for the legal and regulatory, financial and economic and technical and professional capacity of the tenderers.

A tenderer (or a member of the group in case of joint tender, or a subcontractor) is not required to submit the documentary evidence if it has already been submitted for another procurement procedure and provided the documents were issued not more than one year before the date of their request by the contracting authority and are still valid at that date. In such cases, the tenderer must declare on its honour that the documentary evidence has already been provided in a previous procurement procedure, indicate the reference of the procedure and confirm that that there has been no change in its situation.

A tenderer (or a member of the group in case of joint tender, or a subcontractor) is not required to submit a specific document if the contracting authority can access the document in question on a national database free of charge.

2.3.2. Legal and regulatory capacity criteria and evidence

Tenderers must prove that they are allowed to pursue the professional activity necessary to carry out the work subject to this call for tenders. The tenderer (including each member of the group in case of joint tender) must provide the following information in its tender if it has not been provided with the Legal Entity Form:

- For legal persons, a legible copy of the notice of appointment of the persons authorised to represent the tenderer in dealings with third parties and in legal proceedings, or a copy of the publication of such appointment if the legislation applicable to the legal person requires such publication. Any delegation of this authorisation to another representative not indicated in the official appointment must be evidenced.
- For natural persons, if required under applicable law, a proof of registration on a professional or trade register or any other official document showing the registration number.

2.3.3 Economic and financial capacity criteria and evidence

The tenderer must have the necessary economic and financial capacity to perform this contract until its end. The tenderer must comply with the following selection criteria:

Annual turnover of the last two financial years above EUR 110,000 (one hundred and ten thousand); this criterion applies to the tenderer as a whole, i.e. the combined capacity of all members of a group and identified subcontractors in case of a joint tender.

On request from the contracting authority, the tenderer should be able to provide the following evidence at short notice.

- Copy of the profit and loss accounts for the last two years for which accounts have been closed from each concerned legal entity;
- Failing that, appropriate statements from banks;
- If applicable, evidence of professional risk indemnity insurance.

If, for some exceptional reason which the Contracting Authority considers justified, a tenderer is unable to provide one or other of the above documents, it may prove its economic and financial capacity by any other documents which the Contracting Authority considers appropriate. In any case, the Contracting Authority must at least be notified of the exceptional reason and its justification. The Commission reserves the right to request any other document enabling it to verify the tenderer's economic and financial capacity.

2.3.4 Technical and professional capacity criteria and evidence

a. Criteria and evidence relating to tenderers

Tenderers (in case of a joint tender the combined capacity of all members of the group and identified subcontractors) must comply with the criteria listed below:

The project references indicated below consist of a list of relevant services provided (i.e. fully delivered) in the past three years, with the sums, dates and clients, public or private, accompanied by statements issued by the clients.

- <u>Criterion A1</u>: The tenderer must prove experience in the international climate negotiations under the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change on emissions trading accounting under article 17 of the Kyoto Protocol and Article 6.2 of the Paris Agreement.

Evidence A1: The tenderer must provide references for three projects delivered in these fields in the last three years with a minimum value for each project of \in 30,000.

- <u>Criterion A2</u>: The tenderer must prove experience in providing policy advisory services for Kyoto Annex I and Kyoto non-Annex I parties on climate transparency and accounting, and in particular emissions trading accounting under article 17 of the Kyoto Protocol and/or Article 6.2 of the Paris Agreement.

Evidence A2: The tenderer must provide references for involvement² in three projects over the past three years providing policy advisory services in these fields, with at least one project being delivered for a Kyoto Protocol Annex I party, and one project for a Kyoto Protocol non-Annex I party.

- **Criterion A3:** The tenderer must prove capacity to work in English.

Evidence A3: The tenderer must provide references for three projects delivered in the last three years showing the necessary language coverage.

- <u>Criterion A4</u>: The tenderer must prove capacity to draft reports in English.

Evidence A4: The tenderer must provide one document of at least 10 pages (report, study, etc.) in this language that it has drafted and published or delivered to a client in the last two years. The verification will be carried out on 5 pages of the document.

In order to prove their capacity, the tenderer must submit with its tender the evidence listed above.

b. Criteria and evidence relating to the team delivering the service:

The team delivering the service should include, as a minimum, the following profiles:

<u>Criterion B1</u>: <u>Project Manager</u>: At least five years' experience in project management, including overseeing project delivery, quality control of delivered service, client orientation and conflict resolution experience in projects of a similar size (at least € 50,000) and coverage (for Kyoto Protocol Annex I parties and for Kyoto Protocol non-Annex I parties), with experience in management of teams of at least 3 people. The Project Manager should have at least C1 level in the Common European Framework for Reference for Languages³ in English.

Evidence B1: CV, project list and a language certificate or past relevant experience.

<u>Criterion B2</u>: Expert in transparency and accounting, including emissions trading accounting: A higher education degree and at least 3 years of professional experience in climate transparency and accounting, in particular the emissions trading accounting under article 17 of the Kyoto Protocol and/or Article 6.2 of the Paris Agreement. The expert should have at least C1 level in the Common European Framework for Reference for Languages⁴ in English.

Evidence B2: CV, project list and a language certificate or past relevant experience.

<u>Criterion B3</u>: <u>Team for data collection and analysis</u>: collectively the team of at least 2 people should have knowledge of English and proven experience of three years each in data collection techniques.

Evidence B3: CV and a language certificate.

In order to prove their capacity, the tenderer must submit with its tender the evidence listed above.

2.4. Compliance with the minimum requirements

The technical offer must cover all aspects and tasks required in the technical specifications and provide all the information needed to apply the award criteria. Offers deviating from the requirements or not covering all requirements may be rejected on the basis of non-compliance with the tender specifications and will not be evaluated.

2.5. Award criteria

The contract will be awarded to the most economically advantageous tender, according to the 'best price-quality ratio' award method. The quality of the tender will be evaluated based on the following criteria. The maximum total quality score is 100 points.

A maximum of 50 points will be attributed to criterion 1, a maximum of 30 points will be attributed to criterion 2, and a maximum of 20 points will be attributed to criterion 3. In addition a minimum threshold will be set up under this system of points:

<u>- Technical sufficiency levels:</u> Selected companies will have to score a minimum of 25, 15 and 10 points under criteria 1, 2 and 3 respectively, with a minimum total of 65 points.

Assessment of the tenders will focus on the quality of the proposed services therefore tenderers should elaborate on all points addressed by these specifications in order to score as many points as possible. The mere repetition of mandatory requirements set out in these specifications, without going into details or without giving any added value, will only result in a very low score. In addition, if certain essential points of these specifications are not

expressly covered by the tender, the Commission may decide to give a zero mark for the relevant qualitative award criteria.

1 Quality of the proposed methodology (50 points – minimum threshold 50%)

The degree to which the methodology shows the capacity to analyse, review and evaluate documents and figures, in accordance with the needs of the contracting authority. Furthermore the tender must demonstrate the capacity to resolve the questions underlying in the tender in a realistic and well-structured way, as well as whether the methods proposed are suited to the needs set out by the Commission in the Technical Specifications (see part 3).

Sub-criterion 1.1 (10 points – minimum threshold 50%)

This sub-criterion will assess the capacity to:

• *Identify different options for markets accounting.*

Sub-criterion 1.2 (20 points – minimum threshold 50%)

This sub-criterion will assess the capacity to:

• *Identify the key design features for the different accounting options.*

Sub-criterion 1.3 (20 points – minimum threshold 50%)

This sub-criterion will assess the capacity to:

• Assess and compare the implications of the different accounting options and their key design features on key policy objectives.

2 Organisation of the work and allocation of resources (30 points – minimum threshold 50%)

This criterion will assess how the roles and responsibilities of the proposed team and of the economic operators (in case of joint tenders, including subcontractors if applicable) are distributed for each task. It also assesses the global allocation of time and resources to the project and to each task or deliverable, and whether this allocation is adequate for the work. The tender should provide details on the allocation of time and resources and the rationale behind the choice of this allocation. Details should be provided as part of the technical offer and not simply as part of the financial offer.

3 Quality control measures (20 points – minimum threshold 50%)

This criterion will assess the quality control system applied to the service foreseen in these tender specifications concerning the quality of the deliverables, the language quality check, and continuity of the service in case of absence of a member of the team. The quality control system should be detailed in the tender and specific to the tasks at hand; a generic quality control system will result in a low score.

2.5.1 Ranking and Award

Having examined the tenders from a technical point of view, the evaluation committee will proceed considering which is the economically most advantageous offer taking into account only those tenders that have obtained at least 65 out of the 100 points that are available for the technical quality of the bid. The evaluation committee will then proceed with the financial comparison of the tenders retained for further consideration according to the ranking procedure below.

The bid offering the best value for money will be chosen, provided that the minimum number of points cited above is achieved. The ranking of the tenders will be calculated as follows:

- All bids that do not reach the stated technical sufficiency levels for each individual award criteria will not be considered for contract award.
- All bids that have passed the individual levels and score 65 or higher are deemed to be technically sufficient. Then the price is divided by the total number of points awarded to obtain the price-quality ratio. The award of the contract will be made in accordance with the lowest ratio.

The Commission reserves the right not to select any tender if the amounts tendered exceed the budget envisaged for this project.

2.6. Financial offer

The maximum budget allocated to this contract is fixed at € 55,000 (fifty five thousand Euros) excluding VAT (including fees, travel and all other costs. **NB Travel and subsistence expenses should be part of the lump sum and will not be refunded separately**). Any offers received that do not respect this maximum budget will be automatically excluded from the evaluation procedure. For guidance purposes see Annex 3.

The price for the tender must be quoted in euro. Tenderers from countries outside the euro zone have to quote their prices in euro. The price quoted may not be revised in line with exchange rate movements. It is for the tenderer to assume the risks or the benefits deriving from any variation.

Prices must be quoted free of all duties, taxes and other charges, including VAT, as the European Union is exempt from such charges under Articles 3 and 4 of the Protocol on the privileges and immunities of the European Union. The amount of VAT may be shown separately.

3. TECHNICAL SPECIFICATIONS

The <u>Kyoto Protocol</u> (KP) established rules for markets accounting and allowed developed countries listed in Annex B of the Protocol to meet their emission reduction targets through flexibility mechanisms. Targets were expressed as absolute economy wide multi-year emission budgets and divided into "assigned amount units" (AAUs) that can be traded between countries (Article 17). Article 6 of the Paris Agreement (PA) also provides for international trading subject to robust markets accounting but it is likely to differ significantly

from markets accounting under the KP. With all parties having had to come forward with emission reduction targets as part of nationally determined contributions under the PA, all parties now have commitments albeit with greatly varying target types which are often unquantifiable. Moreover, the PA does not specifically refer to AAUs for accounting purposes and contains the new principle of no double counting. As parties begin discussing the implementation of Article 6.2, the need for further technical work to ensure the timely adoption of accounting guidance is evident.

The main but not exclusive sources of information to carry out this service contract are <u>submissions from parties</u> on Article 6.2 to the 45th and 46th session of the Subsidiary Body for Scientific and Technological Advice to the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (SBSTA 45 and SBSTA 46).

Objectives:

The objective of this service contract is to address specific questions that have been identified in the negotiations under the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change, as requiring further technical work to enable the timely implementation of Article 6.2 of the Paris Agreement. Specifically, the purpose of the contract is to:

- 1. Elaborate different possible emissions trading accounting approaches under Article 6.2 of the Paris Agreement.
- 2. Compare the implications of different accounting approaches for key design features and the achievement of key policy objectives.

Task 1: Development of different possible accounting approaches

The contractor is to develop at least two different potential emissions trading accounting approaches, with a particular focus on accounting based on corresponding adjustment in respect of an adjustable emissions balance to be derived for parties participating in cooperative arrangements under Article 6.2 of the Paris Agreement on the basis of their inventory reports. When developing the different accounting approaches, the contractor is to take account of those approaches proposed in submissions by parties and observer organisations on Article 6.2 to SBSTA 45 and SBSTA 46.

The initial findings of Task 1 shall be summarised in a concept note containing graphs and tables to illustrate them. The note shall be submitted within 5 weeks of the signature of the contract.

Task 2: Implications of the different approaches on design features

The contractor is to outline the implications of the different accounting approaches identified in Task 1 on key technical elements of guidance. Thereby, the contractor is to consider, among others, the implications for:

- Reporting and recording, inter alia, what needs to be reported and recorded how and when?
- *Information*, inter alia, what information needs to be provided upfront and what information can be provided later, as well as how often information needs to be provided.

Moreover, the service contract is to consider how the different approaches and their key design features fit together and interact with the remainder of Article 6, as well as the larger accounting, transparency and compliance framework, notably:

- Emission reductions certified under Article 6.4;
- Corresponding adjustments inside and outside the scope or coverage of the nationally determined contributions (including both sectoral and temporal scope), and beyond the ambition of a particular nationally determined contribution.

The initial findings of Task 2 shall be summarised in a concept note containing graphs and tables. The note shall be completed within 10 weeks of the signature of the contract.

Task 3: Implications of the different approaches on key policy objectives

The contractor is to outline and assess how the different accounting approaches identified in Task 1, including their design features identified in Task 2 contribute to achieving key policy objectives. Thereby, the contractor is to consider, among other things, how far each approach:

- Ensures that nationally determined contributions are implemented and incentivise progression or higher ambition over time in the short and long term;
- Ensure environmental integrity, amongst others by preventing structural surpluses or "hot air"; and
- Facilitates linking of carbon market instruments between major emitters.

The contractor shall – within 18 weeks of the signature of the contract – summarise the initial findings on Task 3 in a concept note containing graphs and tables to illustrate and compare the findings.

The notes developed under Task 1, Task 2 and Task 3 are to be included in a final report, which is due in pdf format within 20 weeks after the signature of the contract.

The contractor is required to attend a kick-off meeting with the Commission in Brussels within 2 weeks after the signature of the contract. At the kick-off meeting the contractor and the Contracting Authority will agree on the accounting approaches to be elaborated (Task 1), as well as the key design features and the policy objectives to be assessed under Task 2 and Task 3 respectively. It is expected that a preliminary list of approaches (Task 1) will be included in the tender.

Duration of the tasks

The tasks should be completed within 20 weeks of the signature of the contract. The execution of the tasks may not start before the contract has been signed.

Place of performance

The place of performance of the tasks shall be the contractor's premises or any other place indicated in the tender, with the exception of the Commission's premises.

4. CONTENT, STRUCTURE AND GRAPHIC REQUIREMENTS OF THE FINAL DELIVERABLES

The contractor must deliver the service contract and other deliverables as indicated below.

4.1. Content

4.1.1. Final report

The final report must include:

- an abstract of no more than 200 words and an executive summary of maximum 6 pages, both in English;
- specific identifiers which must be incorporated on the cover page provided by the Contracting Authority;
- the following disclaimer:

"The information and views set out in this [report/study/article/publication...] are those of the author(s) and do not necessarily reflect the official opinion of the Commission. The Commission does not guarantee the accuracy of the data included in this study. Neither the Commission nor any person acting on the Commission's behalf may be held responsible for the use which may be made of the information contained therein."

4.1.2. Publishable executive summary

The publishable executive summary must be provided in both in English and must include:

- specific identifiers which must be incorporated on the cover page provided by the Contracting Authority;
- the following disclaimer:

"The information and views set out in this [report/study/article/publication...] are those of the author(s) and do not necessarily reflect the official opinion of the Commission. The Commission does not guarantee the accuracy of the data included in this study. Neither the Commission nor any person acting on the Commission's behalf may be held responsible for the use which may be made of the information contained therein."

4.1.3. Requirements for publication on Internet

The Commission is committed to making online information as accessible as possible to the largest possible number of users including those with visual, auditory, cognitive or physical disabilities, and those not having the latest technologies. The Commission supports the Web Content Accessibility Guidelines 2.0 of the W3C.

The contractor must deliver the study and all publishable deliverables in full compliance with the corporate visual identity of the European Commission, by applying the graphic rules set out in the European Commission's Visual Identity Manual, including its logo. A simple Word template will be provided to the contractor after contract signature. The contractor must fill in the cover page in accordance with the instructions provided in the template. The use of templates for studies is exclusive to European Commission's contractors. No template will be provided to tenderers while preparing their tenders.

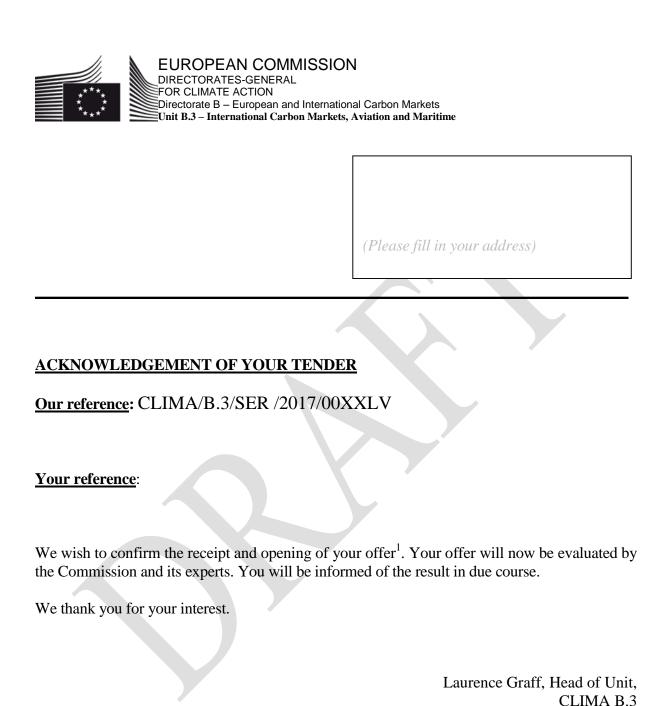
