#### **General Conclusions**

- Improved harmonisation through the present regulatory framework is widely reported and supported
- Importance of close cooperation and information exchange amongst CAs, verifiers, NABs
- Successful peer evaluation of NABs coordinated by the EA
- Sufficient verifier capacity for 2013 emission reports, including through cross-border use of verifiers





## Conclusion - NABs / CAs

- Importance of continued surveillance of NABs
  - Between two peer evaluations, through survey following up on issues
- Key role of the EA central web-link to NAB lists of EU ETS accredited verifiers:

 Restate the importance of continuous information flow between CAs and NABs

Action

• Important for CAs to check AER/VR and to feedback



## Recommendation - NABs / CAs

- Further improve the quality and timeliness of information exchange between verifiers, CAs and NABs
- Implement practical methods to improve communication channels at MS level (e.g. RO forum; CA/NAB informal communication)
- Promote further direct cooperation between Compliance Forum Task Force AV and EA EU-ETS Network
- Ensure completeness and maintenance of NAB databases

#### **Conclusion – Available Guidance**

• Comprehensive AVR guidance, templates, exemplars, tools and FAQ available

- Compendium designed for use as needed
- Challenge remains to encourage greater use greater clarification of user-specific interests?
- Harmonised use of templates (due completion of all fields); particularly important regarding AVR
- Important to maintain the list of AVR FAQ





## **Recommendation – Available Guidance**

- The Commission should consider greater clarification of user-specific interests (e.g. by guidance indexing)
- Further improve guidance, templates and tools based on MS stakeholder experience (special emphasis on more examples)
- Consideration (by COM, CAs, NABs?) of more training and translations for operators





## **Conclusions - Verification**

- AVR is delivering more harmonised accreditations and, therefore, verifications
- Some MS coping with significant changes (new accreditation regime, independent review)
- Use of common templates is important (harmonisation cross-borders)





#### **Recommendation – Verification**

- Consider how to provide greater opportunities for verifiers to feedback opinion (e.g. on guidance)
- Room for improvement in VR through better use of guidance
  - Variations in content and details of verifier reports
  - Interpretation of misstatements, non-conformities and recommendations
