Registries

- Defined in Directive 87/2003/EC, regulated in detail by Commission Regulation 2216/2004
- The job of registries: to ensure the accurate accounting of the issue, holding, transfer and cancellation of allowances
- Double function: MS registries hold both EUAs (units in EU ETS) and other Kyoto units (units not in EU ETS)
- Registries contain accounts:
 - Party holding accounts
 - Operator holding accounts
 - Person holding accounts
 - Cancellation account
 - Retirement account
- Currently 25 registries running, RO registry expected to start up soon. (Community has its own registry as well, but it is currently empty)




The Community Independent Transaction Log

- Job of CITL: to record the issue, transfer and cancellation of allowances, and record verified emissions and surrenders
- CITL is not a registry, but it has a database that contains the same information as the sum of all registries databases
- Harmony between databases is checked every night
- CITL checks every transaction for IT conformity and policy conformity
- Availability 24/7
- Managed by the Commission
- CITL public website provides info on account holders/ allocation/ verified emissions/ surrendered allowances/ compliance status

The Registries system in the Kyoto commitment period

- After 2008, every EUA is also an AAU under UNFCCC rules
- Each EUA transfer between Member
 States needs to be routed to the UNFCCC
 ITL (similar to the ITL) as well
- Three-tier IT system



Review of Directive

- According to Article 30 (f) review should consider "whether it is appropriate for there to be a single Community registry"
- Relevant considerations:
 - **O** Costs
 - Optimisation of IT functions
 - Functioning under the UNFCCC infrastructure
 - Role of Member States
