Where will EU ETS Aviation be in 2014?

- ♦ ICAO September/October 2013
- Possible solution to small emitters issue
- But non compliance will not change
- Verification driving up verification quality and consistency across Member States (Accreditation and Verification Regulations)
- Monitoring plan improvements



Task Force Aviation 2014 (formal)

Priority 1

 Coordinate how MS could handle mergers, splits, bankruptcies and other challenging situations (DE)

Priority 2

- -Exchanging experiences on the verification of the 2013 emission reports and review of AER by the CA.
- Continuing with further harmonisation of issues such as approval of MPs
- -Assisting in the identification of gaps in the guidance documents and application of templates
- -Providing input to guidance on the use and application of the special reserve

Priority 3

 Seeking common approaches on confidentiality of commercially sensitive data



Task Force Aviation 2014 – ICAO

- Co-ordinate action on enforcement
- Be flexible on the work plan
- Assist in implementing outcome of ICAO
- A mechanism to solve problems and share solutions post ICAO as we move to a new or amended scheme
- Continue to facilitate informal communication of CAs and Commission
- Work with Eurocontrol to provide the tools we need and minimise workloads on CAs
