- Maintain knowledge network



Activities of TF CCS in 2023

- Meetings took place on 23 March, 12 June and 23 November (high participation)
- Sharing experiences in CCS and CCU projects development of a database to record CCS projects & policies
- TF paper on CO₂ transfer from mixed source streams by an ad hoc working group
- Presentations from International Energy Agency and ICAP on CCS developments
- Discussions on COM fit for 55 package proposals related to CCS



Looking towards 2024

- The objective of the TF CCS break out session was to identify opportunities to focus and prioritise TF activities in the TF CCS
- Discussion shows that it is important to continue sharing experiences on the topics mentioned in the work plan as the number of countries using or planning to use CCS is growing
- Topics likely to be included in the 2024 work plan concern
 - CO₂ transport and cross border transport
 - CCU
 - Practical implementation issues related to CCS
 - Sharing experiences on CCS projects (on EU and international level)

- Continue to provide input in COM projects and coordinate with relevant organisations such as ICAP and International Energy Agency
- Explore how to prioritise the TF needs and how to improve the effectiveness of the TF further in the upcoming Task Force meetings
