1. COUNTRY HIGHLIGHTS


Seven out of ten (70%) respondents in Estonia consider climate change to be a serious problem, with more than a third (34%) saying that it is a "very serious" problem.


While only 28% of respondents say they have personally taken action to fight climate change in the past six months, in practice the figure is much higher (94%), suggesting that many respondents do not necessarily connect some of these actions with tackling climate change. The most common measures taken are:

- Trying to reduce waste and regularly separate it for recycling (71%, +13 percentage points since 2013)
- Trying to cut down consumption of disposable items like plastic bags (65%, +11 percentage points since 2013)
- Buying locally produced food (54%, +11 percentage points since 2013)

Nine out of ten (90%) people in Estonia agree that fighting climate change will only be effective if all countries of the world act together. A large majority say it is important that their government sets targets to increase the amount of renewable energy used, such as wind or solar power (85%), and provides support for improving energy efficiency by 2030 (88%). Almost six out of ten (59%) agree that fighting climate change and using energy more efficiently can boost the economy and jobs in the EU.







EU28 Outer pie




















How important do you think it is that the (NATIONALITY) government sets targets **0A7** to increase the amount of renewable energy used, such as wind or solar power, by 2030?
