- Work plan Key issues:
 - Assessments initial, surveillance, re-assessment, extension of scope
 - Competence of NAB assessment teams
 - Definition of scope and content of accreditation certificate
 - Administrative measures
 - Procedures for information exchange
 - Cooperation with Commission and Competent Authorities

Two meetings in 2013 - key issues discussed:

- > AVR and EN ISO 14065 requirements
- Guidance developed by the Commission
- Witness policy
- Accreditation certificate content
- ➤ NAB database (AVR, Art. 75(2))
- Questions discussed, e.g. on:
 - -Impartiality and consultancy (AVR, Art. 42; EN ISO 14065, clause 5.4)
 - Fraud (definition and how to assess AVR, Art. 53)



EA-6/03 Review

- Revision of EA-6/03 by a Task Force
- > Final draft out for voting in EA until 18th November
 - Based on comments recieved from EA members, Commission and Competent Authorities
- Structure in accordance with EN ISO 14065
 - Focus on the use for EU ETS
- Link to Commission Guidance Documents
- Mandatory for NAB's accrediting Verifiers for EU ETS
