### 1. COUNTRY HIGHLIGHTS

Respondents in the UK consider climate change to be the third most serious problem facing the world (14%, +2 percentage points since 2013), after poverty, hunger and lack of drinking water (30%) and international terrorism (28%, well above the EU average of 19%). An above-average proportion of respondents say that there is a collective responsibility for tackling climate change (UK: 23%, EU average: 16%).


Personal efforts taken to tackle climate change include:


- Trying to cut down waste and separate it for recycling (79%)
- Trying to cut down the use of disposable items such as plastic bags (52%)
- Buying locally produced and seasonal food (43%)
- Choosing energy-efficient new household appliances (38%)
- Using environmentally-friendly alternatives to private cars, such as walking, cycling, taking public transport or carsharing (38%)
- Improving home insulation to reduce energy consumption (UK: 41%, EU: 23%)

An overwhelming majority (93%) agree that fighting climate change will only be effective if all countries of the world act together.

More than nine out of ten (91%) respondents in the UK - close to the overall EU result - agree it is important for the government to set targets to increase the amount of renewable energy used by 2030.






