Key messages from Day I

- MRVA remains fundamental to implementation and credibility of ETS the wider climate goals
- Increasing cost-effectiveness and efficiency without harming the integrity and accuracy is a high priority
- Current regulations offer opportunities for simplifications which are not yet fully used. Exemplar simplified Monitoring Plan welcomed
- The presentations have provided various good suggestions for TFs to take up in their Workplan considerations
- Compliance Forum is the right platform to share experiences and to identify common view and good practices





Key messages from Day I (cont'd)

- Since the 2014 Compliance Review major improvements recognised in EU ETS compliance
- However, further improvement is justified and is a continuous process
- DECLARE is a key tool for further compliance improvements and increasing the efficiency of MRVA processes
- Important steps made in aviation (CORSIA) and shipping.
- MRVA serve as a solid foundation for global systems
- EU's bilateral cooperation encouraging international MRV/ETS implementation, similar to EU ETS, is bringing good results
- Continuous coordination between EU & MS crucial for maximizing international capacity building efforts





Key messages from Day II

- Need to liaise TFs when exploring opportunities for simplification in the case of cross-cutting issues
- MS good practices can provide input in developing tools that facilitate compliance processes
- Site visits (inspections) are an efficient way for CAs to understand the installation and MP
- Opportunities for MS sharing inspection experiences and approach
- Need for clarity in ETS Aviation in the light of CORSIA
