Malta

1. COUNTRY HIGHLIGHTS

Seven in ten respondents in Malta say that climate change is a “very serious” problem (70%).

Half of the respondents believe their national government is responsible for tackling climate change (50%, EU average: 42%), followed by the EU (43%, EU average: 35%). One fifth say they themselves have a responsibility for tackling climate change (20%, close to the EU average of 19%).

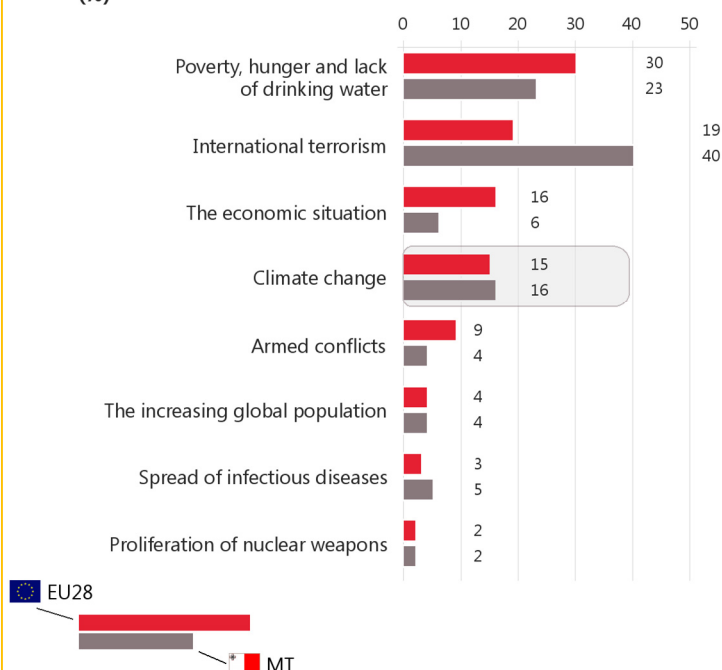
Nearly six in ten respondents say they have taken some personal action to fight climate change in the past six months (58%, above the EU average of 49%). In practice:

- More than three-quarters (78%, +3 percentage points since 2013) try to reduce their waste and regularly separate it for recycling
- Six in ten buy locally produced and seasonal food whenever possible (60%, compared with an EU average of 49%), an increase of 16 percentage points since 2013
- 56% try to cut their use of disposable items whenever possible

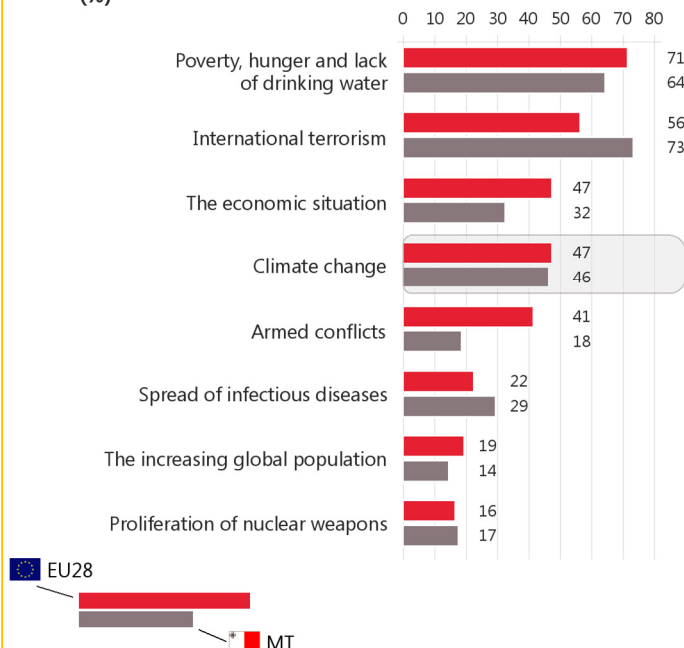
A large majority (84%) think it is “very important” for their national government to set targets to increase the amount of renewable energy used and provide support for improving energy efficiency by 2030. There is a strong consensus (95%) that fighting climate change will only be effective if all countries of the world act together.

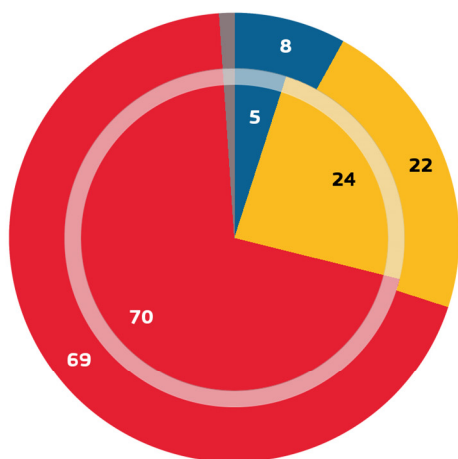

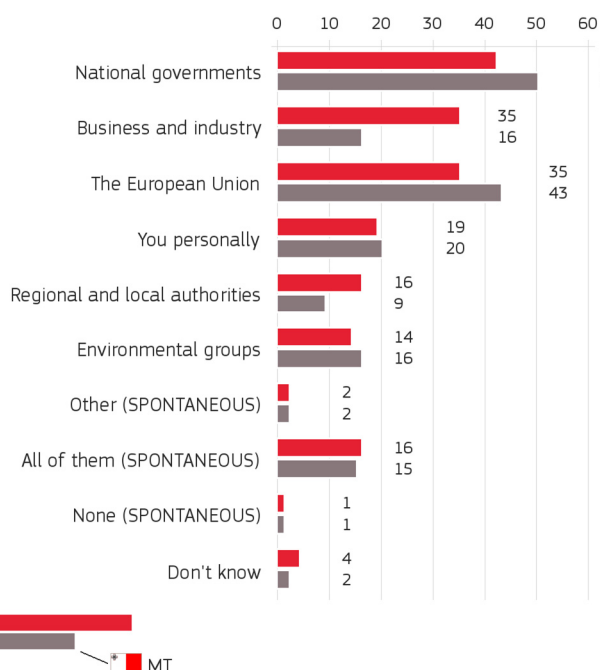

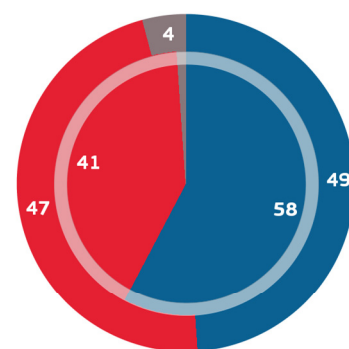
QA3 In your opinion, who within the EU is responsible for tackling climate change? (MULTIPLE ANSWERS POSSIBLE)

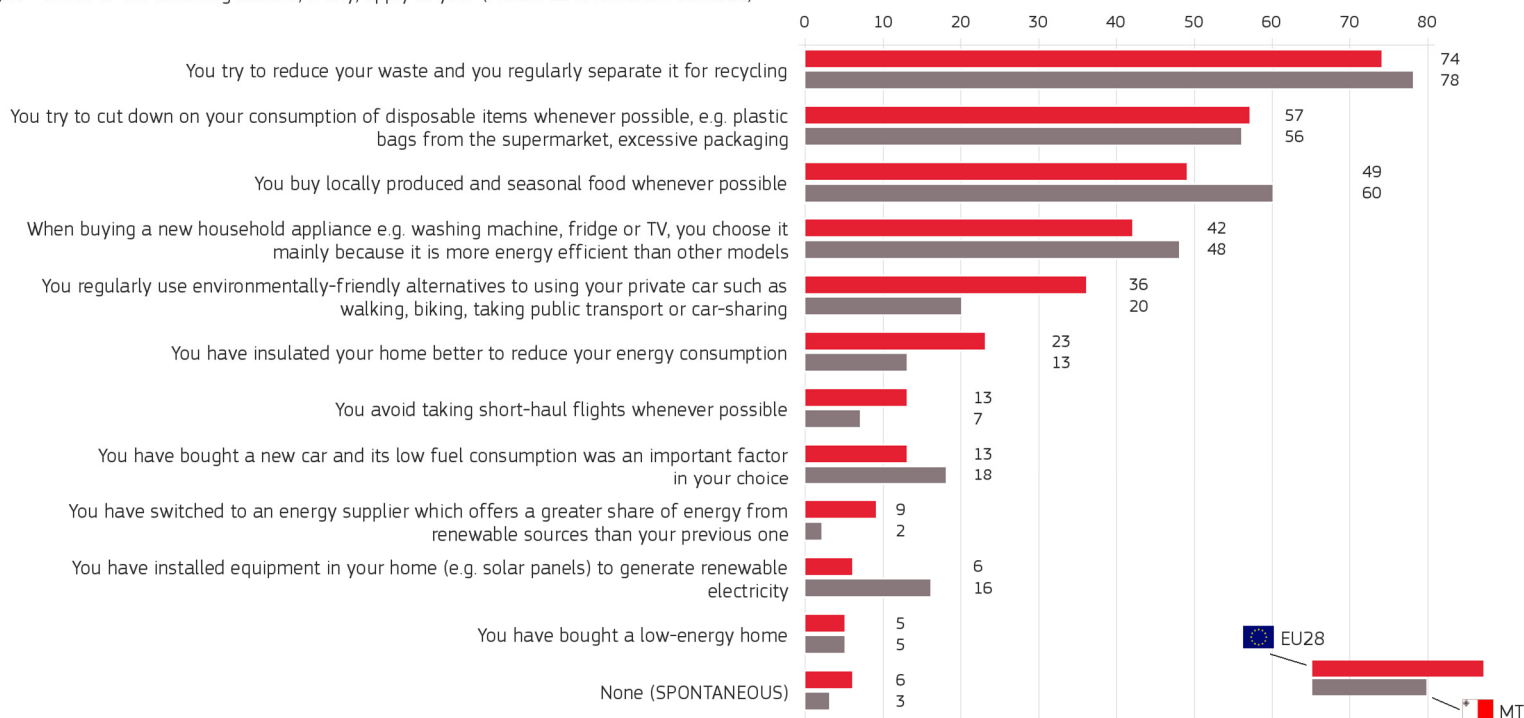

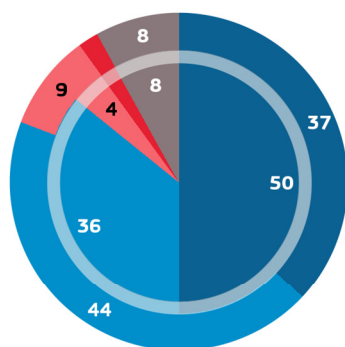
QA6 Which of the following actions, if any, apply to you? (MULTIPLE ANSWERS POSSIBLE)

Fighting climate change and using energy more efficiently can boost the economy and jobs in the EU (%)

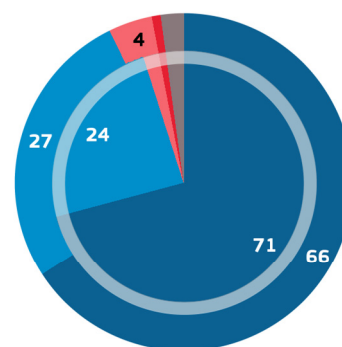

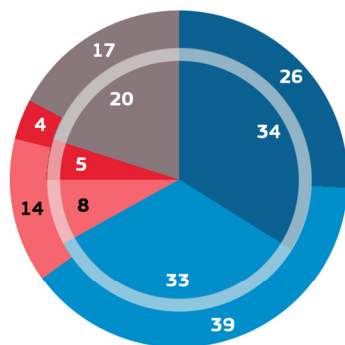

Reducing fossil fuel imports from outside the EU can benefit the EU economically (%)

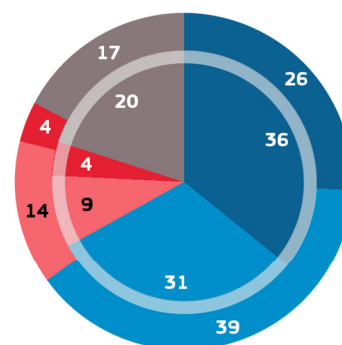

Reducing fossil fuel imports from outside the EU can increase the security of EU energy supplies (%)



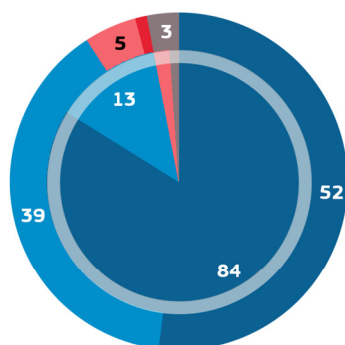

(%)

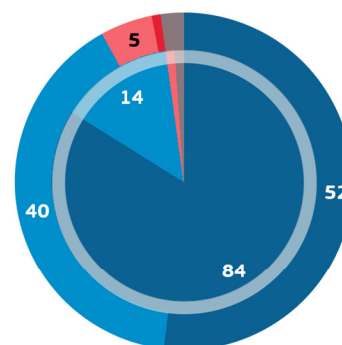
