1. COUNTRY HIGHLIGHTS


Nearly nine in ten respondents in Spain see climate change as a 'very serious' problem (86%), well above the EU average (74%). This share has risen by 7 percentage points since the previous survey in 2015, yet respondents are only slightly more likely than the EU average to see climate change as the most serious global problem (13%, EU average 12%).


More than six in ten of those surveyed say they have taken personal action to fight climate change in the past six months (62%, EU average 49%). However, when given specific examples this rises to almost nine in ten (89%), suggesting that many do not associate certain actions with tackling climate change.

- Over three-quarters try to reduce their waste and regularly separate it for recycling (77%, EU average 71%), while nearly six in ten try to cut down on consumption of disposable items whenever possible (58%, EU average 56%).
- The share regularly using environmentally-friendly alternatives to their private car has fallen by 16 pp since 2015, to 19% (EU average 26%).

Respondents in Spain are more likely than the EU average to agree that fighting climate change and using energy more efficiently can boost the EU economy and jobs (85%, EU average 79%), that it is important for the government to set targets to increase the use of energy from renewable sources by 2030 (94%, EU average 89%) and that the government should provide support for improving energy efficiency by 2030 (92%, EU average 88%).










ES Inner pie










