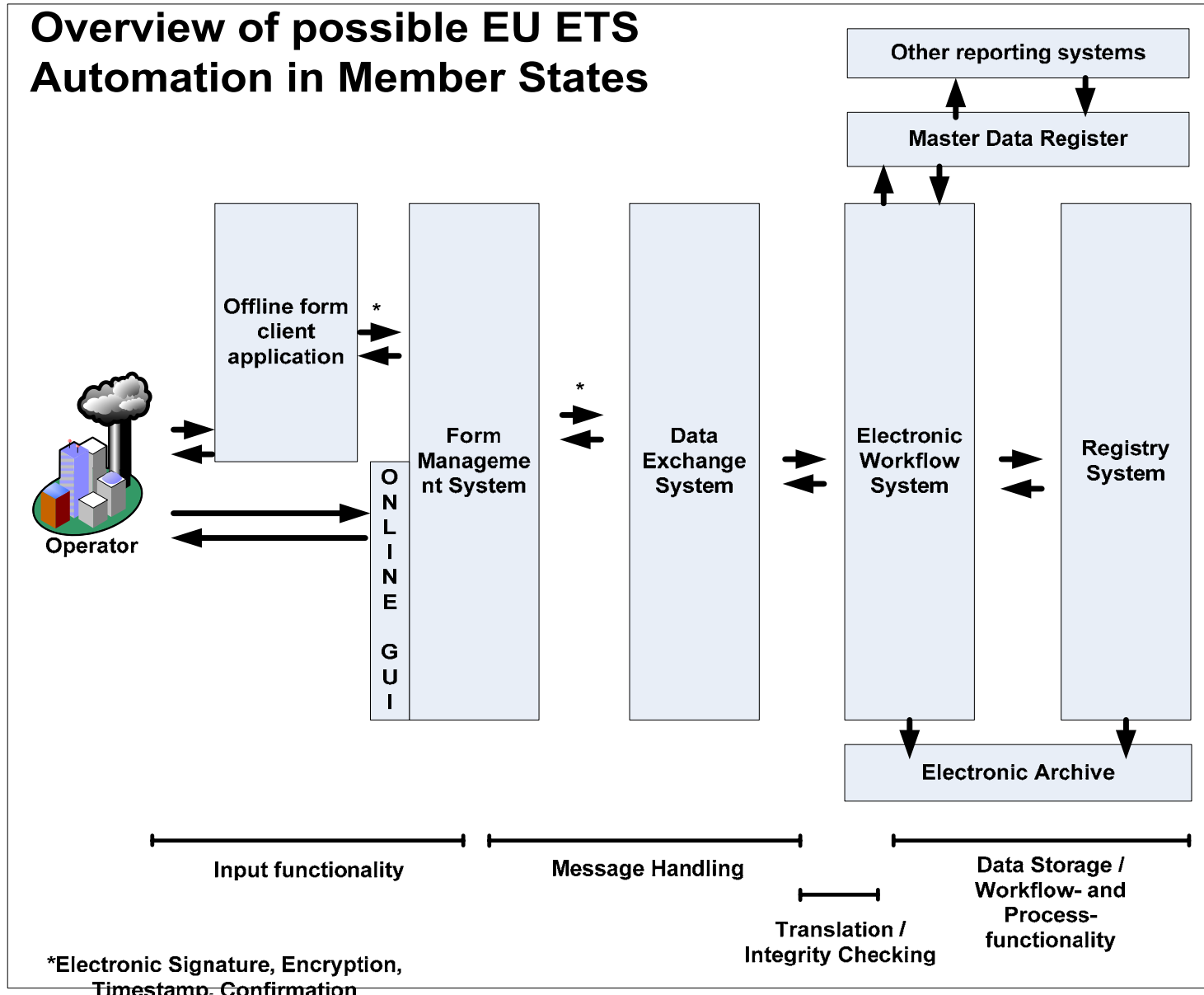

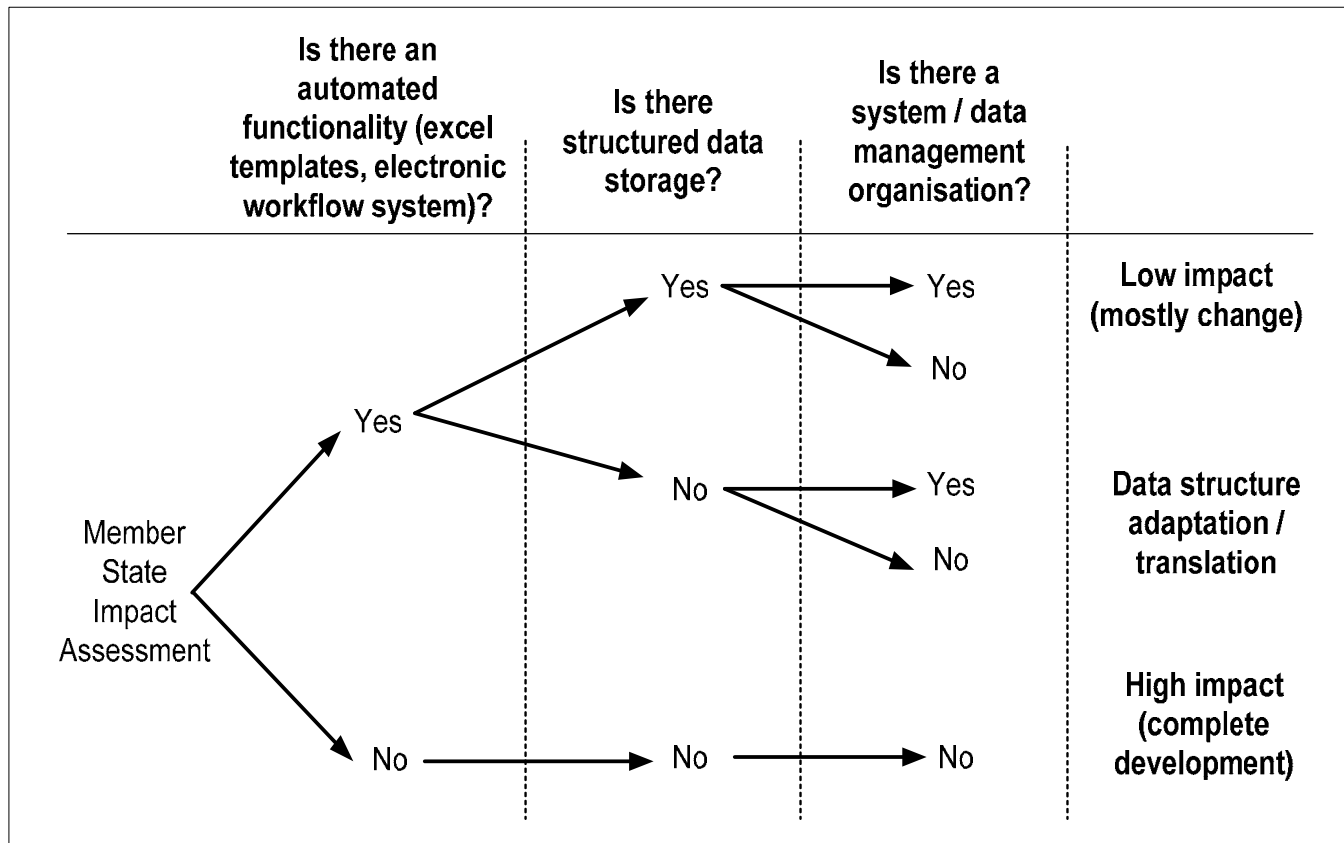

Implementation and maintenance by EC - Legal Options

2010 – 2012:

- Legal basis for annual reporting; MP submission only aviation
- Options: publish EU ETS Language in full or reporting only
- Flexibility needed: CA use own templates, with common data sets
- Implementation and maintenance

2012 and beyond:

- Regulation may include requirements on automated systems and data exchange formats
- Legal options:
 - (a) keep as 2010-12
 - (b) like INSPIRE (implementing provision)
 - (c) as b and link to Community Registry, art. 21
 - (d) through central repository at EC

Recommendations 2010-2012

CIION

- (legal) embedding now & future
- change management
- support development of common services
- strategy for role of Registry/art.21
