

# **Background: ETS Compliance cycle**



Phase III compliance cycle activities:

- 1 Permit and MP submission
- 2 CA approval of MP
- 3-4 Emission monitoring during calendar year
- **5 AER by operator**
- 6 Verified AER and VR
- 7 Verified AER and VR submission to CA
- 8 CA check of Verified AER
- 9 Surrender of allowances
- 10 CA inspection on operator
- 11 Accreditation of verifiers
- 12 NAB peer evaluation
- 13 Exchange of information
- **14 Continuous Improvement**

- Peer review of the NABs by the European cooperation for Accreditation (EA)
- Monitoring by the Member States (MS)





# **Background: ETS Compliance cycle**

- Effort to ensure harmonised, consistent, effective implementation of MRR and AVR
- Development of MRVA guidance documents, tools, templates, FAQs
- Initiative to facilitate harmonised electronic reporting (development and update of common reporting language)
- Compliance Forum as a platform for CAs to discuss, find solutions to common issues and exchange experience





# ETS Compliance Cycle: Projects for 2014

- EU ETS Member States Peer Review
  - as further tool to pursue harmonisation and effective capacity building

- EU ETS Member States Compliance Cycle Evaluation
  - as a way to assess the status of implementation





# ETS MS Peer Review: objectives and approach

- Evaluation of ETS compliance cycle implementation and reporting under ETS Article 21 - done by **peers**
- Learning exercise and sharing of experiences to enhance MS procedures and compliance regime
- NOT an audit
- Open two-way communication, mutual trust and cooperative atmosphere between MS host and reviewers
- Participation on a voluntary basis (both as host MS and as reviewer)

# Peer Review Methodology development

- Definition of a methodical, clear and repeatable procedure
- Possible elements of the methodology
  - Objective settings and definition of issues to be analysed
  - Process definition (activities, their relationships and sequence, on-site visits)
  - Criteria for the selection of host MS and review team
  - Criteria for the assessment of the collected data and information
  - Planning and scheduling of the review activities
  - Reporting of the evaluation findings and dissemination of the learning





#### **Peer Review execution**

- Based on the defined methodology
  - Selection of 2 MS as host countries (on a voluntary basis)
  - Selection of reviewers
  - Preparation of background materials and information
  - Review execution (including MS visits)
  - Collaboration is pivotal for a good outcome
- Sharing of information, relevant findings, best practices among MS





## **ETS Compliance Cycle Evaluation**

- Follow-up to 3 previous projects
- Recomendation for the Commission from the last project on the 2008 and 2009 compliance cycles:
  - Need for more clarity in the future MRR and AVR
  - Ensure common approaches through guidance, templates and tools
  - Improve the exchange of information and experience among MS
  - Enhance the use of IT
- Collaboration is a key





# 2014 Compliance Cycle Evaluation Objectives

- Analysis of MS implementation status in relation to 2013/2014 ETS compliance cycle
  - Compliance with MRR and AVR requirements
  - MS specific provisions
- Definition of best practices, successes and shortcomings, possible inconsistencies among Member States
- Definition of actions and recommendation for the Commission to further improve effectiveness, harmonisation and consistency





# 2014 Compliance Cycle Evaluation High Level Approach

- Identification of EU ETS compliance issues to be assessed in each MS, covering all the steps in the process
  - permitting (including approval of the monitoring plan)
  - notification of changes in the monitoring plan
  - reporting and verification of reports
  - accreditation
  - inspection and enforcement
- Collection and evaluation of data (MS input and collaboration is essential)

Action

Evaluation of data at MS level and possibly at sectoral level
