2013 follow-on project

- M&R (and A&V) elements to be considered for finalising guidance:
 - First feedback from MS on experience using existing guidance
 - Update of existing guidance as appropriate
 - Complement of existing guidance with further documents, templates, exemplars and tools
 - Collection of FAQs from MS and model answers





Possible new M&R topics

- Templates for improvement reports
- Templates for notifying MP changes
- List of applicable standards
- Update of Annex VII (minimum frequency of analyses)
- Develop list of default values for biomass materials (if possible)
- Guidance on estimation methods for determining biomass in mixed fuels
- Application of EN14181 to CEMS
- Exemplar MPs/RA/procedures/sampling plans/etc.
- Flow, N2O, CCS





Possible new A&V topics

- Key inherent and control risks (lists)
- Examples of process analysis type tests
- Verification in relation to CEMS and EN 14181
- Verification man-day table (to assist NABs/NCAs)
- Guide to NAB peer evaluation (for CAs)
- Examples of peer evaluation equivalence for NCAs
- Guidance on NAB/NCA administrative measures
- Verification of sustainable biofuel/bioliquid use

Proposals for the next ETERP

- Update of XETL in line with the requirements of the MRR and AVR
 - Missing Phase III fields
 - Data quality check mechanism
 - Removal of duplications
- Update of IT Blueprint and guidance (as appropriate)
- Options for longer term governance system
 - Structured change management procedure
 - Steering Committee, Technical Working Group, Administrative Back Office and Technical Support
- Options to facilitate greater Member State uptake of XETL and related systems





Update of the ETS Article 21 Questionnaire





Article 21 Report: legal background

- Directive 2003/87/EC Art. 21(1): Every year MS shall submit to the Commission a report on the ETS Directive implementation
- Items: allocation of allowances, operation of registries, application of the monitoring and reporting guidelines, verification and issues relating to compliance with the Directive and on the fiscal treatment of allowances
- Directive 2009/29/EC maintains the Article 21 requirements, but replaces MRG with MRR and AVR





Phase I and II Implementation

- Commission Decision 2006/803/EC and questionnaire:
- Revised ETC questionnaire discussed in 2009 in WG3 with MS but never formally adopted
 - Takes into account changes due to the inclusion of N2O, partially on aviation and CCS, into the trading scheme following the 2007 MRG revision and its amendments
 - Most of MS are already informally using this draft, uploading their reports on EIONET
- New requirements related to Registries, Benchmarking, Auctioning, NSG are not taken into account in the revised ETC questionnaire





Objectives for Current Project

- To support relevant revision of Commission Decision 2006/803/EC and its questionnaire in order to take into account all the new requirements developed under the revised "ETS Directive", Directive 2009/29/EC
- To support re-launch of "Article 21 reporting" as an important tool in overall ETS compliance strategy
- Moreover the project should justify the requirements for the data requested (reasons and uses)





Examples: Article 21 Data

- Example use: To evaluate trends (year on year) with view to advising future policy developments:
 - Areas of non-compliance (e.g. failure to submit AERs)
 - CA coordination carried out and benefits
 - CA/NAB/NCA coordination and/or information exchange and identified benefits/difficulties
- Notes recalled from adoption of the MRR:
 - MS approaches to ETS use of sustainable biofuels and bioliquids
 - Proposed innovative techniques relevant to permanent storage





Proposed Methodology

- Identification and prioritisation of requirements to support revision including impact assessment
- Ad-hoc "Revision of Article 21" TWG
- Potential presentation to 2013 Compliance Conference:
 Note of relevant feedback
- Further relevant updates to MS via WG3 and CCC





Further Thoughts

- Focus should be on helpful exchange of information in order to promote improvements
- Possibility to use the Article 21 questionnaire to best target peer review effort





2013 Peer Review Project





Pilot Study (2011)

- Objectives of Peer Review: "Tool" in support of the annual Article 21 Report aimed at promoting greater harmonisation of MS implementation of ETS, and improvements in the compliance cycle
- 2011 Hosts: (i) NL; (ii) DK
- 2011 Review Team: UK, Latvia, Estonia, Portugal and Poland/UNECE
- Process: Inspection of the EU ETS implementation in host country; interviews with experts; open minded and constructive discussions; exchange of recommendations and best practice





Main Pilot Study Conclusions (2011)

- If well prepared and organised, can be an effective and welcomed instrument for improving ETS compliance
- Allows thorough discussion between EU ETS experts from different Member States/Competent Authorities
- Enhances learning from each other/observation of choices other MS's have made
- Promotes reflection on reasons for selections in the past and whether changes in the compliance processes could be an option (at home)
- Could become additional compliance assuring instrument, complementary to the Article 21 report





Peer Review Project 2013

- Sufficient support secured at the 11th July 2012 CCC meeting to proceed with a follow-up peer review exercise in 2013 (expressed July 2012 CCC):
 - Bulgaria as reviewer
 - Poland as reviewer/possible host
 - Netherlands as a reviewer
 - UK as a host/reviewer
 - Previous expressions of interest noted from Lithuania and Estonia

Aviation ETS Small Emitters - Restricted call for a contractor

Aim: accurate and detailed understanding of the impacts on small emitters emitting less than 25 000 tonnes of CO2 per year

ToR includes inter alia the following tasks:

- Costs for small emitters and competent authorities
- Simplifications regarding MRV and registry
- Alternative thresholds
- Alternative means of regulating emissions

Consultations with all Member States and Norway and Iceland





Planning

26 September - Restricted call

17 October, 16.00 - Deadline for tenders

29 October, 14.30 - Opening of the tenders

December - Start of the project (runs 6 months)

Maritime GHG emissions – Background for study on MRV

- International maritime transport only sector not covered by EU's GHG emission reduction commitment
- Decision 406/2009/EC (ESD) and Directive 2009/29/EC (ETS Review) of the European Parliament and the Council call for an EU action if no international agreement was approved by 31 December 2011
- Commission's work programme 2012: Legislative initiative on maritime GHG emissions, proposal expect for QI/2013
- Impact assessment to be finalised before end of 2012
- Commission supports initiatives for global agreement in the IMO

Action



Maritime GHG emissions – Study on MRV

- Aim: Prepare the implementation of an EU-scheme for MRV for ships in view of a possible legal proposal addressing maritime GHG emissions
- Contract not yet awarded, but kick-off of study planned for December 2012
- Close co-operation with Member States' experts foreseen
- Tasks include:
 - Development of MRV procedures;
 - Assessment of needs for registers and databases
 - Development of requirements for verification and accreditation
