1. Selected high-level findings

- MRAV system is working
 - Improvements from Phase II to III in all areas
- Significant harmonisation achieved
- Guidance and clearer requirements facilitated common understanding
- Some variations in areas not specified in AVR or MRR to be expected; for example:
 - EU ETS combined with other necessary inspections vs. EU ETS-specific inspections
 - Integrating EU ETS permit into other permits vs. separate

Climate Action



1.1 Findings: Monitoring

- MS use flexibility provided in MRR for low emitters to different degrees
- Simplification was not always achieved
- Low uptake of CEMS
- Permitting & MP approval process was a challenge
 - Not all MPs approved in time for verification
 - Approach to improvement reports inconsistent



1.2 Findings: Verification

- Overall there is a much more consistent approach
- Yet, wide variety in the quality of verification reports
- Verifiers may not always understand materiality or document consistently
 - Not enough understanding of their role to check that the MP is in line with the MRR and that nonconformities are highlighted.



1.3 Findings: Reporting

- Greater harmonisation on content of AER through frequent use of Commission template
- IT systems for reporting enhance the reporting and review process
- Review approach ranges from basic to extensive



1.4 Findings: Accreditation

- NABs that are part of EA appointed in most MS
- Generally, good information exchange between NABs and CAs
- Room for improvement on cross border information exchange
- Certification of verifiers that are natural person no longer plays significant role
 - Only 1 in the entire EU ETS



2. Sample Recommendations: Guidance

- Need for further guidance on some topics
 - Inspection
 - Uncertainty assessment
- Need to make guidance more accessible
 - Through examples for different scenarios
 - Decision tree/mapping/indexing to quickly find relevant guidance and skip what is not critical
