- *Discuss the practical steps required to plan a successful inspection*
- *Croatia: Discussion of their inspection plan. They use Inspection IRAM Easy Tool for planning of inspection. Have also a checklist*
- *Italy: Choosing the installations they want to inspect is based on a risk profile assessment*
- *Germany: Discussion on preparing an inspection plan for the provided cases*

Conclusions break-out session IV

- *Member states use different methods for choosing which installations they wish to inspect*
- *Half of the group conducts dedicated EU ETS inspections. Half combine the EU ETS inspection with other inspections. One relies entirely on verifiers and does not conduct inspections*
- *It is not uncommon to find deviations during a site inspection that went unnoticed by the verifier*
- *Different methods used for correcting emission discrepancies uncovered during inspection*

- *Mutual Learning process*
- *Competent authority gains a great deal the inspections-understanding of installation*
- *Operators gain also a better understand of how to increase the quality of their reporting*
