More than 9 in 10 EU citizens consider climate change a serious problem



Climate change is considered...

a **very** serious problem (7-10)

by **77%**


a **fairly** serious problem (5-6)

by **16%**

not a serious problem (1-4)

by **7%**

More than 6 in 10 EU citizens say they have taken action to fight climate change over the past six months



93% of EU citizens have taken at least one action to fight climate change



tried to reduce waste and regularly separated for **recycling**



tried to cut down on consumption of **disposable items** whenever possible (e.g. plastic bags)



considered lower energy consumption when buying a new household appliance (e.g. fridge or tv)



bought and ate **less meat**



bought and ate more **organic food**

Climate Change

67% of EU citizens think that their national government is not doing enough to tackle climate change



More than half of EU citizens think that national governments and the EU are responsible for tackling climate change



To relieve the economic pressure caused by the energy crisis, EU citizens think that the EU and the national governments should:

- Accelerate the roll-out of renewable energy in EU to bring the cost of energy down and become more energy independent 29%
- **Take economic measures** to limit the price of energy bills for households such as tax energy companies' profits and impose energy price caps 29%
- **Give direct financial support** to the most economically vulnerable members of society 16%
- 4 **Invest more** in energy efficiency measures (e.g. improved insulation) 15%
- **Diversify the supply** of fossil fuels imports into the EU 6%
