# Use of IT and E-reporting in discussion since 1st Compliance Conference, 8-9 September 2008

#### Priority II of CF Workplan 2009-2010:

- Development of XETL to allow workflow automation for EU ETS processes, and development of electronic templates for MP's and AERs for the aviation sector
- Analysis of options and methodologies for developing an electronic reporting format for EU-ETS

#### Progress realized on priority II:

- 1. UK leads TF XETL/E-reporting from 2009 till now, June 2013
- 2. Three Commission projects on ET E-Reporting (ETERP), i.e. ETERP-I 2009/10; ETERP-II 2011/12 and ETERP-III 2013
- 3. Major efforts made in 2009-2012 to convince MS of need and advantages of E-reporting and use of IT only partly successful
- 4. Development of Excel templates (2010) for Monitoring Plans for Aviation proved a major step forward in convincing MS
- 5. Art. 74 and Art. 75 of MRR provide legal basis requiring the use of electronic formats and confirming the status of XETL
- 6. Range of Excel templates for EU ETS compliance processes been developed for monitoring, reporting, verification etc.

# June 2012 TF E-reporting discussed with COM progress to date & next steps

- 1. Governance structure and procedures
- 2. Further development of XETL towards the 3rd Trading Phase
- 3. Exploring longer term prospective and Roadmap to 2016

#### Conclusions from the TF meeting:

- ➤ Commission to initiate ETERP –III, addressing
  - ✓ Governance issues of XETL and
  - ✓ Further development XETL for Phase III ETS
- > TF to initiate questionnaire to assess (again) interest of MS in common IT the state of affairs on IT applications & plans


# TF initiated questionnaire to MS in Sept. 2012 Questions:

- 1. Do you have an IT system for EUETS operation and compliance?
- 2. If No are you planning an IT system for EUETS in the future?
- 3. If Yes: are you planning to update your system before Phase III (start date 1st Jan 2013)?
- 4. If Yes, do you support the use and management of the common EU ETS language (XETL & Governance)?
- 5. Would you welcome a common minimum IT approach to reporting and compliance, similar to the common EU Registry used across the EU?

## Summary of IT System Usage

- 23 Member States replied (of the EEA 30)
- 9 MS are involved with CF Task Force
- 14 MS have IT systems and developing –surprising (2 MS shared solutions; many individual solutions; 3 MS have no system but are developing)
- 1 MS seriously considering; others have no system but many would consider; some need a change in law to apply
- No replies from 8 MS

Questionnaire showed major progress in use of IT, though quite different in capabilities, and great interest in XETL & common solutions to MRV



#### Task Force aims to:

- ✓ Ensure XETL is fit for purpose (Phase III)
- ✓ Support implementation of XETL and governance structure for management and change control
- ✓ Discuss impact of XETL and its adjustments for determining governance process
- ✓ Support COM in engaging MS in IT development and involving other stakeholders
- ✓ Promote benefits of XETL in facilitating EU ETS compliance;
- ✓ Develop ways to promote XETL and its uptake.

#### In 2014 Task Force intends to

- ✓ Review implications of ETERP III outcomes: impact update of XETL
- ✓ Provide input and support to Governance structure and procedures
- ✓ Communicate benefits of XETL and how it fits into global EUETS picture
- ✓ Promote wider use of XETL through linkage to Commission templates
- ✓ Focus on XETL becoming standard for GHG reporting schemes
- ✓ Hold stakeholder workshop promoting use of XETL
