## 1. COUNTRY HIGHLIGHTS

Around eight in ten (86%) respondents in the Czech Republic say that climate change is a serious problem, with 61% considering it “very serious”. At least half believe that business and industry and national governments are responsible for tackling climate change (53% and 50% respectively).

While just over a third of respondents in the Czech Republic (36%) say they have personally taken action to fight climate change in the past six months, this figure rises to 96% when they are shown a list of practical measures, suggesting that many respondents do not connect certain actions with tackling climate change.

The main measures taken include:

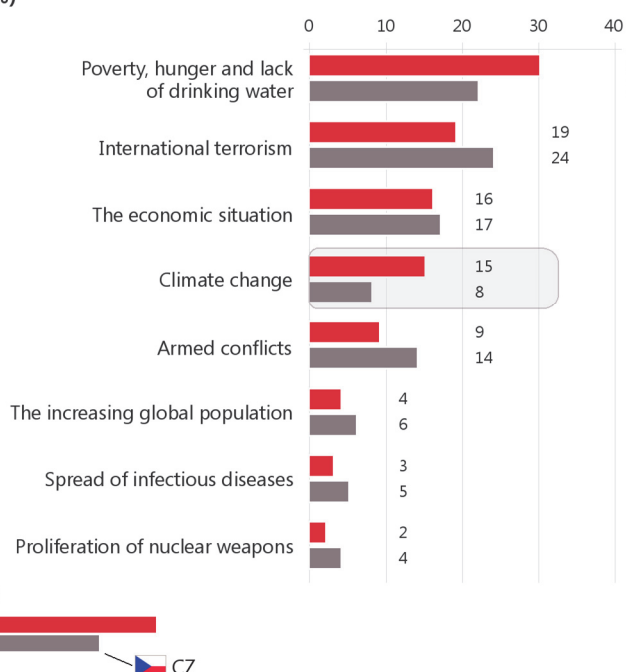
- Trying to reduce waste and regularly separate it for recycling (79%, +9 percentage points since 2013)
- Trying to cut down the consumption of disposable items such as plastic bags and excess packaging (54%, +4 percentage points since 2013)

An overwhelming majority (89%) believe it is important for their national government to provide support for improving energy efficiency, and almost 90% agree that fighting climate change will only be effective if all countries of the world act together.

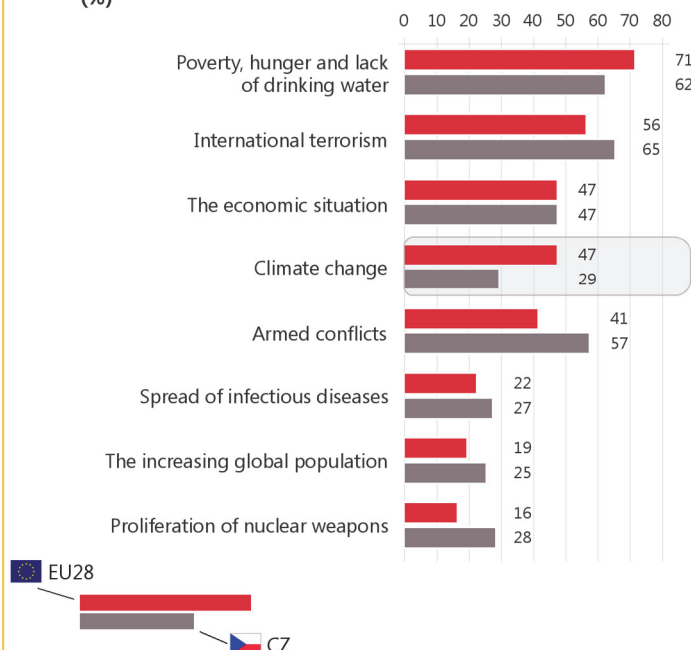
Finally, there is widespread agreement (74%) that fighting climate change and using energy more efficiently can boost the economy and jobs in the EU.

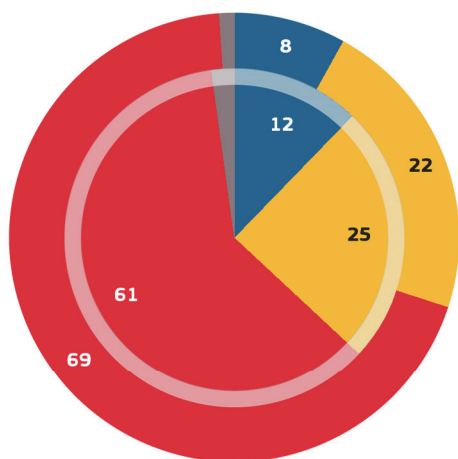

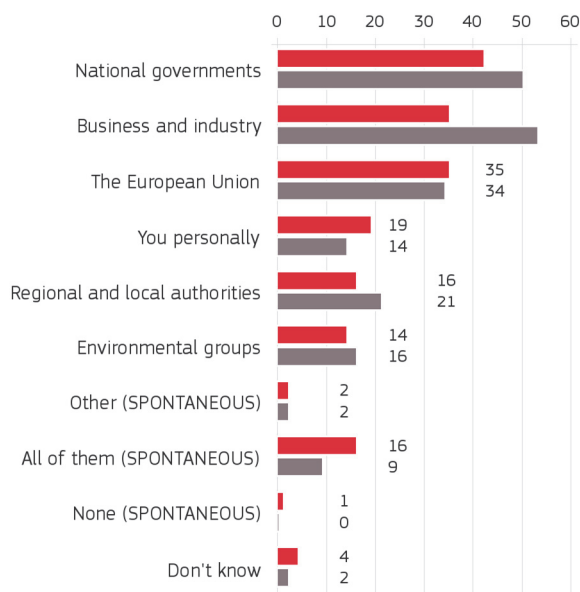

**QA3** In your opinion, who within the EU is responsible for tackling climate change? (MULTIPLE ANSWERS POSSIBLE)

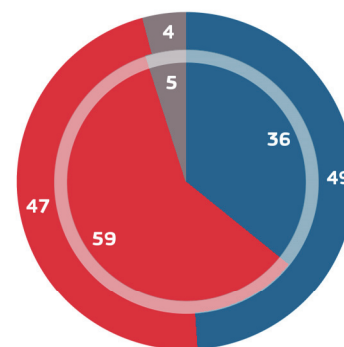

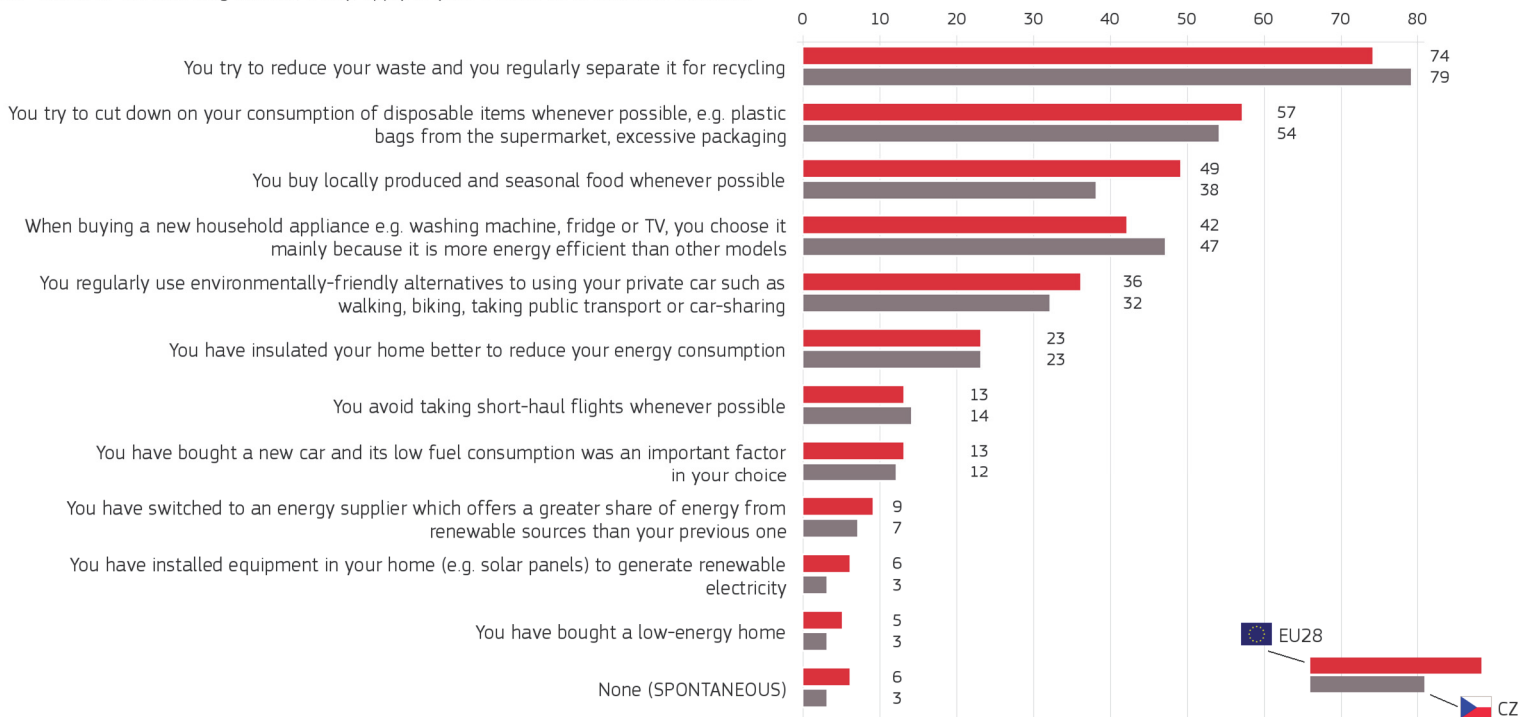

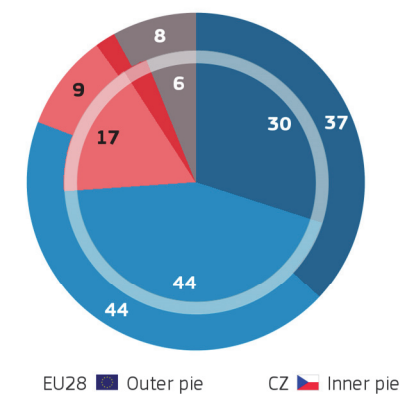
QA6 Which of the following actions, if any, apply to you? (MULTIPLE ANSWERS POSSIBLE)

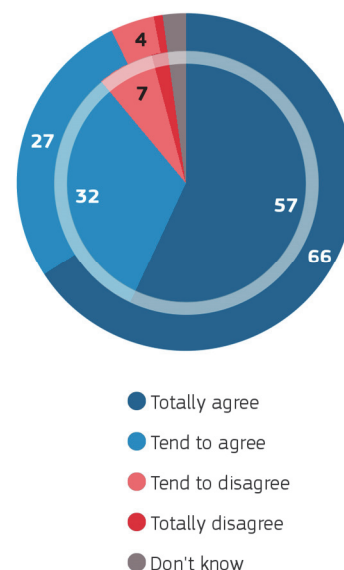

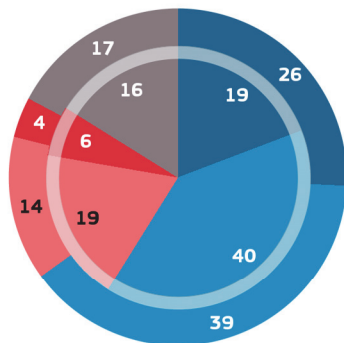

**Reducing fossil fuel imports from outside the EU can benefit the EU economically (%)**



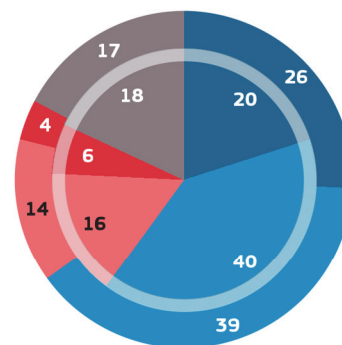

**Reducing fossil fuel imports from outside the EU can increase the security of EU energy supplies (%)**



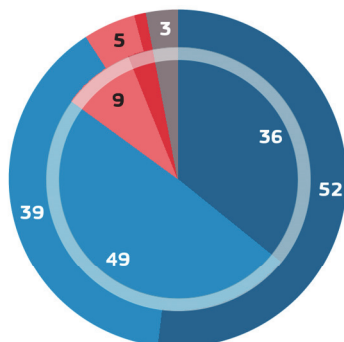

(%)



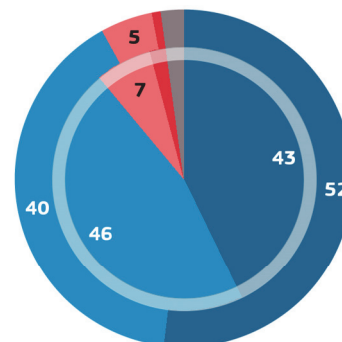
