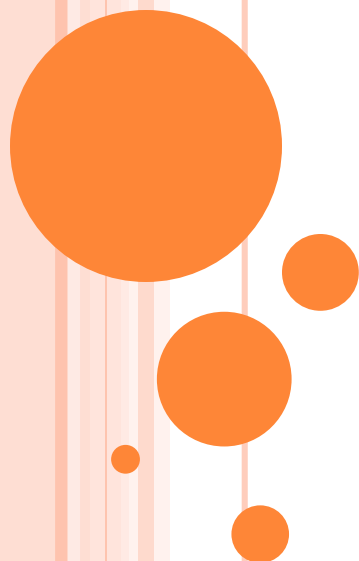

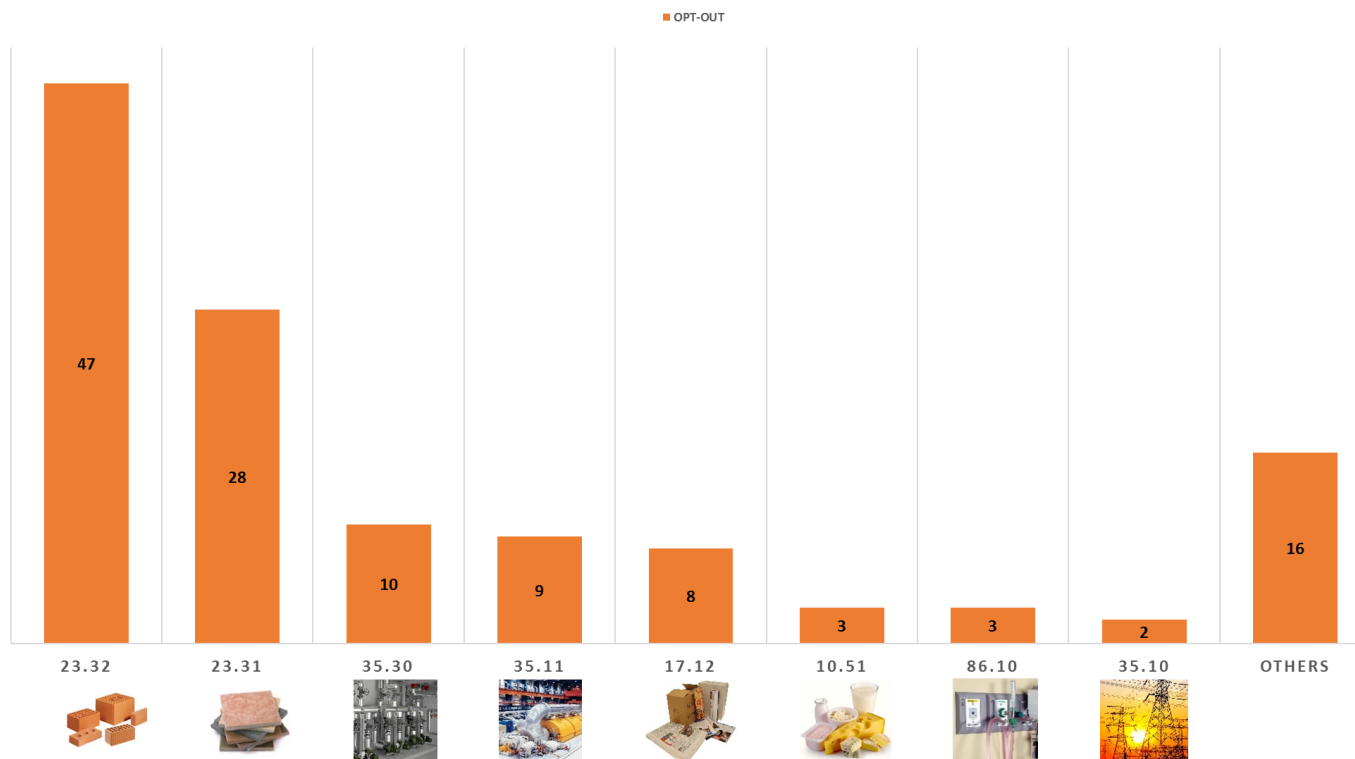

## ITALIAN SMALL EMITTERS - PHASE III

- Italy asked for the exclusion of 166 installations from 2013 pursuant to ETS Directive, Art. 27 (emissions  $<25 \text{ ktCO}_2$  in each of the 3 previous years, 2008-2010 and for combustion inst. nominal power  $<35 \text{ MW}_{\text{th}}$ );
- Currently (2018), **126 «Small Emitters»** are active, with the following NACE code distribution.
- The majority of installations are related to **ceramics production**





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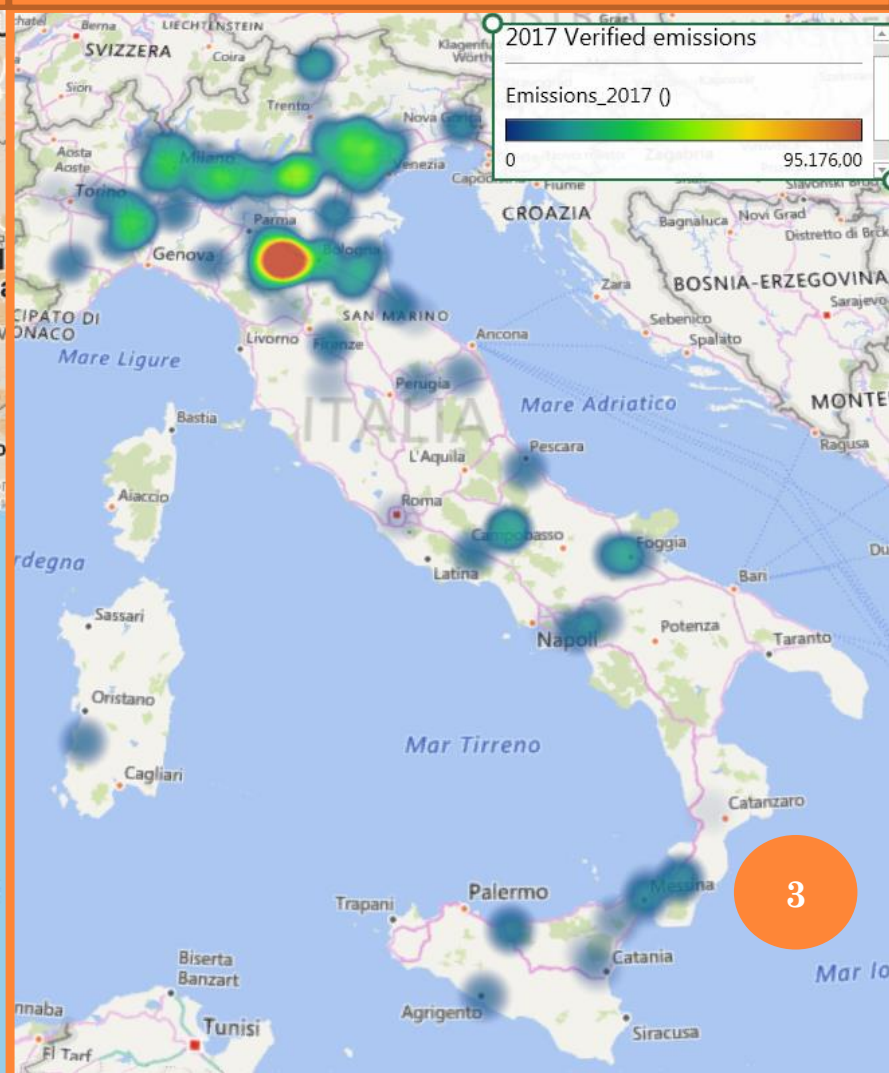
# WHERE ARE «SMALL EMITTERS» LOCATED

- Most installations are **concentrated in Northern Italy**,
- majority related to **ceramics** are in **Emilia-Romagna and Veneto**

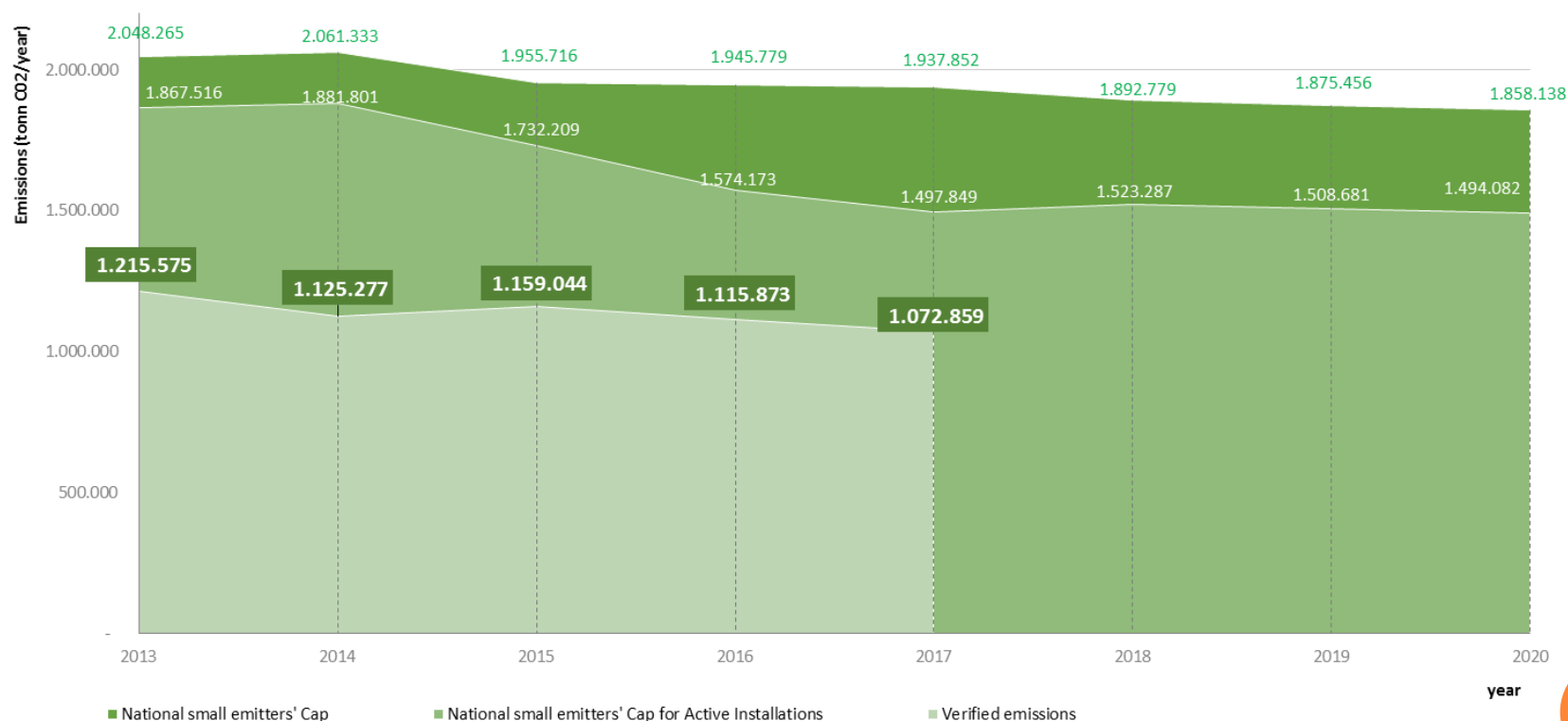




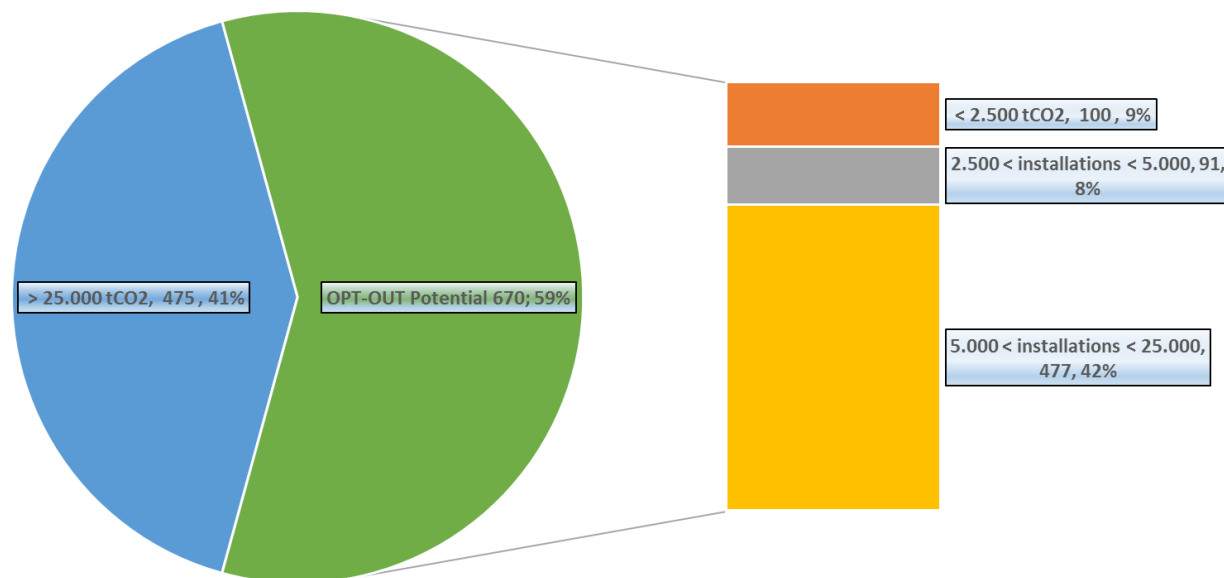
# EMISSIONS COMPARED TO TARGET



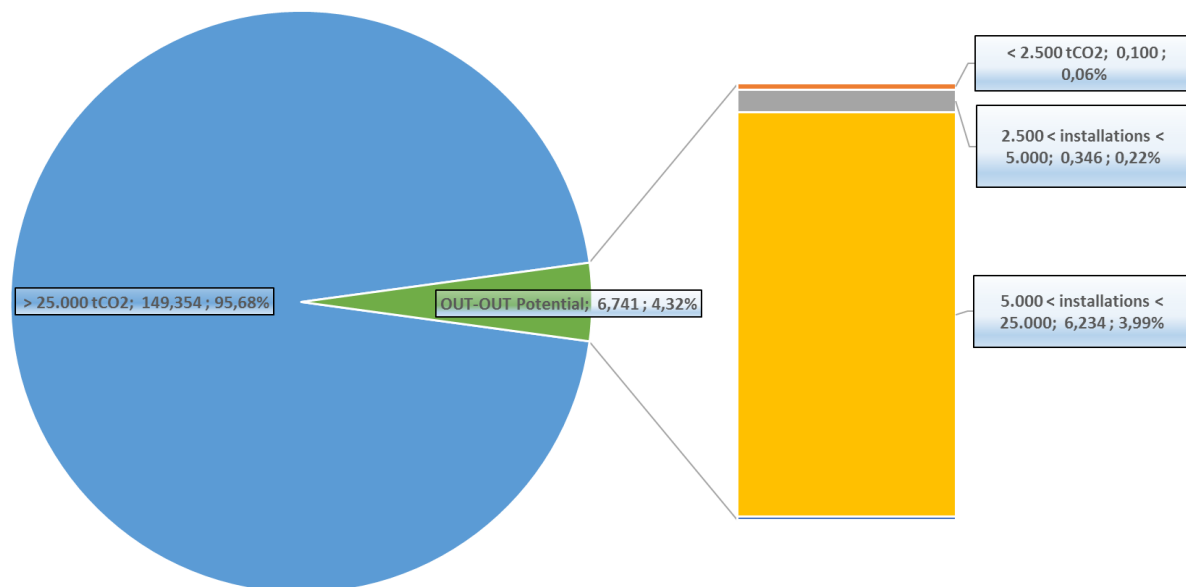
- In 2017 small emitters emitted -45% compared to the aggregated annual target (sum of each installation target)
- **Emissions reduced -2,9%/year (from 2013) VS -1,74% of EU ETS LRF**



# POTENTIAL SCOPE – PHASE IV



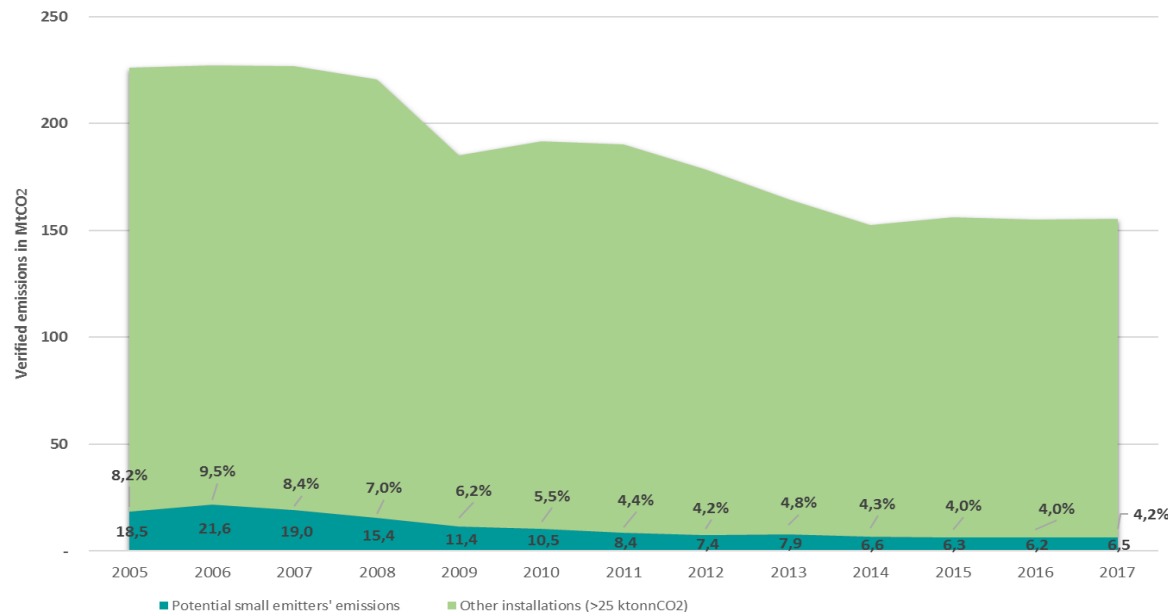
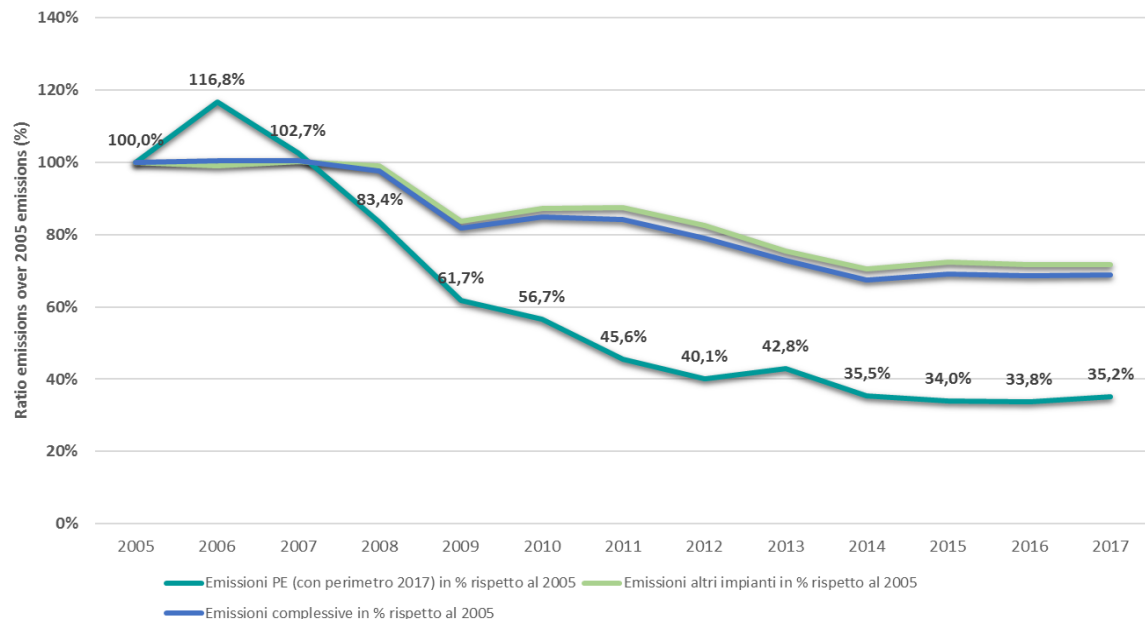
- Potential small emitters are the majority (59%) of installations;



- but, their emissions are **just 4%** of Italian 2017 verified emissions



# POTENTIAL OPT-OUT PHASE IV EMISSIONS REDUCTIONS



- Italy is the second Member State for absolute ETS GHG emission reductions compared to 2005 (-70,7 MtCO<sub>2</sub>, -31,3%)
- Italian **potential small emitters** for phase IV **gave an higher relative contribution** compared to other Italian ETS installations (-64,8%);
- Small emitters' emission share decreased (8,2% in 2005, 4,2% in 2017)
