1. The problem

Lack of quantitative and qualitative limitation in initial ETS phases has had the following consequences:

ETS	CDM
Main driver of the surplus	Low-cost mitigation projects (weak additionality and social standards)
Opportunity cost: lack of investment within the EU industry (risk of long term competitive disadvantage when carbon constrain effective)	Money not going where it is the most needed

2. ETUC position

- International credits = complementary instruments to domestic efforts → EU-wide cap on their use within ETS
- Only from projects which deliver genuine benefits in terms of Sustainable Development (mitigation additionality and social standards)
- Social standards should apply through a mandatory approval procedure based on the following criteria:
 - Project promoter's pledge to respect OECD guidelines for multinationals, ILO Basic Conventions and ILO Conventions 155 and 169
 - Social sustainability, covering employment (number of jobs created, skills' development, quality of employment) equity and access to essential services such as water and energy
 - The involvement of civil society organisations and social partners in project assessment procedures

Specific remarks

- No « price buffer »: need permanent cap and strong environmental and social requirements
- No double-counting: use of international credits should not be accounted to comply with financial commitments made by developed countries (100 bn in 2020)
- Quantitative and qualitative limitations should also apply under the scope of ESD
- No access in the EU to offset credits from countries without an ambitious pledge on its whole economy in the context of the future climate agreement (except from LDCs)
