MRVA Guidance: Objectives

- To ensure availability of relevant guidance and tools to assist common understanding, application and compliance concerning the EU ETS M&R and A&V Regulations
- To further Commission aims regarding correct and harmonised implementation and well-functioning of the ETS, including in connection with promoted consistency and cost-effectiveness
- To provide a practical and user-friendly package to assist CAs, operators/aircraft operators, verifiers, NABs, NCAs

- Coordination with other initiatives (e.g. Task Forces)
- Setting priorities

- Development of 1st draft of guidance document / template / FAQ / exemplar
- Feedback and comments by TWG on 1st draft
- If appropriate:
 - Development of 2nd draft
 - Feedback and comments by TWG on 2nd draft
- Development of final draft
- Consultation with WG3 and, if appropriate, Endorsement in CCC

ETS Article 21: Legal basis

• Directive 2003/87/EC: Article 21(1)

Each year the Member States shall submit to the Commission a report on the application of the ETS Directive

- Particular attention to the arrangements for:
 - allocation of allowances
 - operation of registries
 - implementation of M&R, A&V and issues related to compliance with the Directive
 - fiscal treatment of allowances





ETS Article 21 questionnaire: Legal basis

 Commission Decision 2006/803/EC establishing a questionnaire for reporting on the application of ETS directive

Use of ERUs and CERs in the community

Surrender of allowances

Issues related to compliance

Access to information (Art 17)

Fees and charges

Main 2006 Questionnaire topics:

Competent authorities

Coverage of activities and installations

The issue of permits for installations

Application of MRG

Arrangements for verification

Operation of registries

Arrangements for the allocation of allowances - NEC

The legal nature of allowances and fiscal treatment

Article 21: General Project Objectives

- Bring Article 21 questionnaire in line with revised legislation i.e. Phase III requirements
- Evolve questionnaire towards a report providing "compliance" and "management" information useful to the Commission, Member States and CAs
- Ensure that Article 21 reporting requirements are met and overall EU ETS compliance strategy is supported





Article 21: Specific Project Objectives

- Increase the quality, completeness and consistency of information available to Commission and other stakeholders on ETS implementation within MS
- Increase Member State confidence in the Article 21 questionnaire and its effectiveness
 - Rationale and purpose for each questions
 - Focus on truly relevant information
- Improve the efficiency of completion of the Article 21 reporting by MS





Article 21: Project Approach

- Identify problem areas
 - Careful evaluation of current questionnaires
 - Identification of new issues
- Develop options for revising the questionnaire
- Assess the options for revising the questionnaire
 - Include administrative burden/benefits of simplification
- Develop proposed revised questionnaire
- Develop guidance material
- Finalise proposals for revised questionnaire & guidance for WG3 submission & CCC vote





Article 21: Problem definition

Causes

Questionnaire not appropriate for expanded scope of ETS and new legislation MS use two different versions of the questionnaire

Questions phrased in ambiguous way Reporting info with low benefit/ cost ratio

Inefficient reporting mechanisms Reporting of unnecessary information

Duplicate reporting

Problems

Completeness, quality & consistency of information received by EC MS perception that Article 21 submissions add no value for them MS perception that EC does not respond to Article 21 submissions

Unnecessary administrative burden on EC & MS

Consequences

Reduced MS confidence in Art 21 instrument and its effectiveness EC not sufficiently
able to oversee
implementation/
compliance or
develop new policy
based on trend
analyses

Limits lessons learnt and best practice Limited information on functioning of carbon market and the effectiveness of EU ETS

Increased stakeholder costs (e.g. operators' annual MS fees)



ETS E-reporting: Advantages of IT systems

- Efficiency of EU ETS compliance cycle
 - Less administrative burden
 - Better and faster access to information
 - Better ability to track and trace workflows
 - Automation of key requirements
- Enhanced capacity for reliable data storage





ETS E-reporting: Advantages of IT systems

- Improved quality of data
 - consistency (setting of minimum requirements, ensuring consistent/appropriate returns)
 - completeness (automatic diagnostic checking)

Action

- transparency (easier access to data)
- trueness (avoid errors due to manual intervention)
- Enhancement of EU ETS credibility and confidence



ETS E-reporting: Legal basis

• DIRECTIVE 2003/87/EC

Art 14 "Monitoring and reporting of emissions"

4. The regulation referred to in paragraph 1 may include requirements on the use of automated systems and data exchange formats to harmonise communication on the monitoring plan, the annual emission report and the verification activities between the operator, the verifier and competent authorities

• COMMISSION REGULATION (EU) No 601/2012

Article 74 "Electronic data exchange formats"

Member States may require the operator and aircraft operator to use electronic templates or specific file formats for submission of monitoring plans and changes to the monitoring plan, as well as for submission of annual emissions reports, tonne-kilometre data reports, verification reports and improvement reports.

Article 75 "Use of automated systems"

- integrity, confidentiality, authenticity, non-repudiation of data
- Access control, availability





ETS E-reporting: Background

XETL (eXtensible EU ETS reporting language)

- E-reporting language supporting the EU ETS activities
- Developed in line with MRG 2007
- Based on two xml schema (EUETSRequest, EUETSReport)
- Consisting of seven messages

Permit request

Permit update

Permit cancellation

Monitoring plan update

Annual emissions report

Emissions report update

Verified emissions report





ETS E-reporting: Project Objectives

- Develop, evaluate and prioritise options for establishing longer term governance system
- Update and improve XETL and file format specifications and guidance
- Develop and evaluate options to facilitate
 Member State IT development involving uptake of XETL and associated tools





ETS E-reporting: Approach for Governance options

- Define scope of governance and change management
- Develop options taking account of international experience (e.g. XBRL)
- Identify role of stakeholders per option (e.g. EC, E-reporting Task Force, software providers)
- Options evaluation
 - pros and cons
 - short and longer term barriers and risks
 - Costs estimate





ETS E-reporting: Approach for XETL Update

- Identify required changes
 - Phase III mandatory updates
 - Gaps, anomalies, duplications prioritised
 - Quality checks prioritised for compliance
 - Mindful of interfaces with other data systems
- Update schema
- Test schema
- Update guidance





ETS E-reporting: Approach to facilitate MS IT uptake

- Propose full range of options to promote added uptake of XETL-web based systems by MS, incl.:
 - No intervention
 - Unilateral development
 - Joint development (shared purchase)
 - Licensing of MS existing system
 - Development of central/default system by EC
- Evaluate mechanisms, complications (technical, political, legal), benefits, costs
