Wopke Hoekstra

Commissioner for Climate Action, European Commission

Hoekstra is European Commissioner for Climate Action since 9 October 2023. He leads the European Commission's work on climate change and will represent the European Union at COP28, ensuring continued strong commitment to long-term climate neutrality and the Fit for 55 objectives. Previously, Mr Hoekstra served as the Deputy Prime Minister of the Netherlands and Minister of Foreign Affairs since 2022, and Minister of Finance from 2017 to 2022. Prior to his ministerial experience, he was a Member of the Senate from 2011 to 2017. He worked at McKinsey &

Company until 2017 and in commercial positions at Shell between 2002 and 2004.



Teresa Ribera

Spanish Minister for Ecological Transition and Demographic Challenge

Teresa Ribera is Deputy Prime Minister of the Spanish Government and Minister for the Ecological Transition and Demographic Challenge. Prior to that, Ms Ribera was Director of the Institute for Sustainable Development and International Relations (IDDRI) from 2014 to 2018, and enabled the Institute to play a key role in the negotiation of the Paris Climate Agreement and the transition towards sustainable development. She served as the Spanish Secretary of State for Climate Change and Biodiversity from 2008 to 2011, responsible for environmental and climate policies,

as well as the National Meteorological Agency. A public official from the Senior Corps of State Civil Administrators, she has also taught as professor in public law at the Autonomous University of Madrid.



Cecilia Kinuthia-Njeng

Executive Secretary, United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC)

Ms. Cecilia Kinuthia-Njenga, Director for Intergovernmental Support and Collective Progress, United Nations Framework on Climate Change Convention (UNFCCC), is an Economist/Urban and Regional Planner with over twenty-seven years of progressive work experience in international sustainable development, climate change and conservation. Her current role involves supporting the Presidency and incoming Presidency of the UNFCCC Conference of the Parties (COP) and facilitating the interaction between governing and subsidiary bodies and the constituted bodies under the climate change Convention.

During the last 30 years, building on her leadership, managerial capacity, establishing strategic partnership and inter-agency cooperation, Cecilia has delivered high-impact projects and programmes that have transformed institutional and governance structures to deliver results and improve the lives of many people around the world. Previously for 10 years (2011-2021), Cecilia served as Head of the UNEP office in Pretoria where she rolled out over 40 programmes on climate change, biodiversity conservation, green economy, circular economy and environmental governance.



Johan Rockström

Director, Potsdam Institute for Climate Impact Research

Johan Rockström is Director of the Potsdam Institute for Climate Impact Research and Professor in Earth System Science at the University of Potsdam. He is an internationally recognized scientist on global sustainability issues and led the development of the Planetary Boundaries framework for human development in the current era of rapid global change. Professor Rockström is a leading scientist on global water resources, with more than 25 years experience in applied water research in tropical regions, and more than 150 research publications in fields ranging from applied

land and water management to global sustainability. He is i.a. member of European Commission expert group: Mission Board for adaptation to climate change including societal transformation, chair of the Earth Commission, Chief Scientist of Conservation International, and elected member of the German Academy of Sciences Leopoldina.

Mark Gitenstein is the United States Ambassador to the European Union since 2022. Gitenstein is a lawyer who recently retired from Mayer Brown LLP, where he had served over the last 30 years as partner and counsel. He served as U.S. Ambassador to Romania and began his career with 17 years of service in the U.S. Senate on the Judiciary and Intelligence committees, working i.a. for then-Senator Biden, co-chairing his transition to the vice

presidency in 2008 and helping set up his transition to the presidency in 2020. Since 2009 he has focused on preserving and fortifying democracy by ensuring transparency in equity markets, fighting corruption, and strengthening the rule of law. He earned a BA from Duke University and JD from Georgetown Law School, was awarded the Star of Romania, the nation's highest civilian honour, by the president of Romania in 2012, and the American Bar Association's Silver Gavel award for his book Matters of Principle.



Adélaïde Charlier

Co-founder, Youth for Climate

Adélaïde Charlier is the co-founder of Youth For Climate Belgium, and defines herself as an activist for social and climate justice. Over the past years, she contributed to various mobilizations, crossed the Atlantic Ocean by sailboat, participated in conferences such as COP28 and the Amazonia Centro del Mundo summit in Brazil, raised awareness among young people and schools about engagement, and advised the Vice-President of the

European Commission Timmermans to support strong measures addressing the challenges of our generation. She has worked with activists from all over the world, such as Greta Thunberg and Anuna de Wever, to deliver her message of the urgency to act in the climate crisis, to various politicians, i.a. Ursula Von Der Leyen, Angela Merkel and Emmanuel Macron. Besides her activism, she studies Political Science at the College of Europe.
